Gov't Is Committed, Asked To Speed Grant

As the result of a province-wide meeting on physical fitness and amateur sport at the Charlottetown Hotel yesterday, Hon. L.G. Dewar, minister of education, will be asked to commit the federal government to the establishing of the National Fitness Amateur Sports Grants and at the same time make an effort to speed up the signing of the federal-provincial agreement, so that monies could be made available this current fiscal year.

This was one of three resolutions adopted at the meeting, which was attended by approximately 70 persons.

In another resolution, Dr. Dewar was also asked to appoint, through the executive

council, an advisory committee to the fitness and amateur sport program at his earliest possible opportunity.

The final resolution stated that an expiratory date of two to three weeks following the signing of the agreement be set for the submission of briefs, suggestions and resolutions to the provincial plan or program.

Reports were heard on provincial assistance for sports and competitors representing P.E.I. at interprovincial and national sports events, provincial non-competitive sports and provincial branches of national bodies, and awards and titles.

War Amputations Services To Be Available To Civilians

James D. Shepherd, president of the Prince Edward Island Branch of the War Amputations of Canada, has announced that an appointment of a committee to administer the war amputation civilian liaison program in the district under the jurisdiction of his branch. The chairman of the committee is Keith Murray, and the other members are Richard J. Lawler, Daniel J. MacDonald and Eric E. Hallett.

This program, adopted by the Dominion board of directors of the War Amputations of Canada in April of this year, will make available the experience and facilities of the members in the fields of rehabilitation and training for civilians who suffer the loss of limb or limbs through amputation.

The basis of the program is outlined in the following 14 points: An advisory service for persons who, through elective surgery, have been warned of the necessity of the amputation of a limb or limbs; an advisory service during the post-operative period for persons who have suffered the loss of a limb or limbs; an advisory service to the family and relatives of an amputee; information and demonstrations concerning the best type of orthopedic appliances, based on data gathered by the War Amputations of Canada prosthetics committee.

This program will be nationwide in scope and will offer the services of the War Amputations of Canada prosthetics committee.
