THE BOER CAMPAIGN.

Methods in the Field: Probable Plans of the Opposing Force.

The preparations on both sides indicate that in the struggle between the British and the Boers that now appears inevitable, the principal fighting will take place in and near the angle of territory in Natal that lies between the Drakensberg Mountains and the Buffalo River.

Although their military organizations made considerable progress since their last war, the Boers mean to abide by their tactics that have proved so effectual in the past.

With the exception of the troops detailed to defend Pretoria and occupy Johannesburg fort, the whole of the Boer forces are mounted, and are reckoned at 35,000 men.

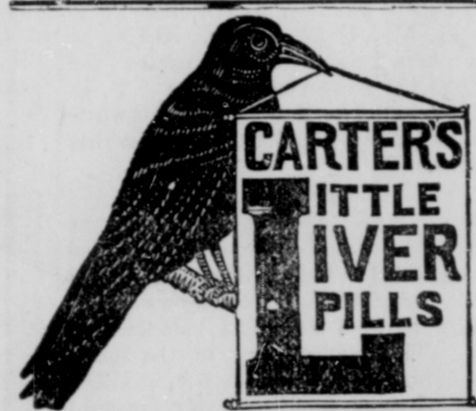
The Boer tactics may be briefly described as great mobility, rapid power of concentration on vulnerable points, rapid retreats therefrom if seriously threatened, but before this eventuates, hoping to achieve a victory, and most certainly inflicting great losses.

The opinion of the Boer officers is that if the British employ less than 80,000 men they are safe. On the British side the belief is that if one big victory is won at the start the bubble of the Boer resistance will burst; but if, on the other hand, the British force should meet a check, the consequences to British prestige and supremacy would be most serious.
