

# New Star Of Nehru Family Brightens Indian Politics

NEW DELHI (AP) — A star of the Nehru family is brightening the way for the collective leadership trying to guide India through its second dangerous government crisis in two months.

Mrs. Indira Gandhi, the late prime minister Nehru's daughter, has risen to new prominence with the illness of Prime Minister Shastri, bedridden with a heart attack, and is being mentioned in this capital as a potential foreign minister or even head of the government.

She will be Shastri's top aide if he tries to regain firm control of the government. He decides his health will not permit this, she will be a leading contender to succeed him.

Officially, Mrs. Gandhi, 47, is only the third-ranking member of the cabinet. Shastri formed to pull India out of political turmoil that followed her father's death May 27. But she will speak for India when she arrives in London today with Finance Minister P. T. Krishna-machari, No. 2 in the cabinet, for the Commonwealth prime ministers' conference.

**WILL BE COURTIED**  
It is Mrs. Gandhi, not her higher-ranking colleagues, who will be courted in coming weeks by foreign ambassadors trying to determine which way the diplomatic wind is blowing in New Delhi.

Above all, it will be Mrs. Gandhi who is expected to guard the committee-led government from political attack. There are forces working in the capital to see that collective leadership does not work and that a new prime minister will be chosen.

Left and right wings of Shastri's ruling Congress party are reviving dreams of a new government to be formed by the middle-road government Shastri formed June 9. Formerly he has been seen as a moderate.

The left wing, led by defence minister V. K. Krishna Menon, is hopeful the party will turn to it for leadership.

The right wing, led by Shastri's top aide, fulfills the party's "newspaper" government, "press ahead" and "press ahead" in dealing with a current food shortage. When Nehru's death in 1964, earlier this year, extremists took the same line in a drive for power.

**LOST CLOSE FIGHT**  
The party's right wing, led by former finance minister Morarji Desai, feels it narrowly lost the battle of succession after Nehru's death and has solid political backing for another try. In spite of the party's extreme successions, Mrs. Gandhi will be co-operating with Krishna-machari, home minister Gulzari Lal Nanda and two strong political figures — Kumar-

wami Kamraj, Congress party president, and S. K. Patil, Bombay party boss, and railway minister.

Mrs. Gandhi, a widow, has wielded considerable influence in the Congress party and the government for several years. During Nehru's last years, she was at his side almost constantly and travelled with him to many international conferences. Her primary interest in government has been directed at foreign affairs.

## Nfld. Explores Power Export Via Nova Scotia

**LONDON (CP)** — Premier Joseph R. Smallwood of Newfoundland has confirmed that the Newfoundland government has asked a British firm to investigate the possibilities of transmitting electric power from Labrador's Hamilton Falls project to the New England states via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia.

Smallwood said in an interview that a British firm, Preece, Cartwright and Ryder of London, had issued a preliminary report saying the transmission of power via Newfoundland was both feasible and economic.

"We now are awaiting their definitive report," said Smallwood, who leaves for a week's holiday in the Middle East Tuesday before returning to Canada at the middle of the month. Smallwood added:

"I now confirm published statements that the Newfoundland government has requested Canadian Javelin limited to act as selling agents for the sale of large volumes of hydroelectric power to the six New England states."

Smallwood described the British firm his government had consulted as "the greatest independent authority in the world on long distance and submarine transmission of electric power."

Smallwood said he understood there had been an exchange in the Quebec provincial legislature last week concerning the distribution of power from the Hamilton Falls project via Newfoundland without any form of consultation or communication," he said.

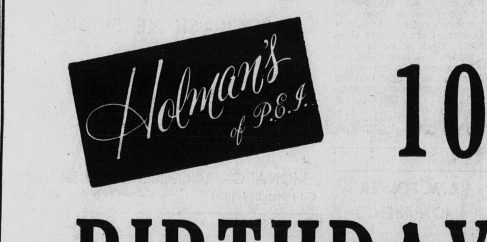
