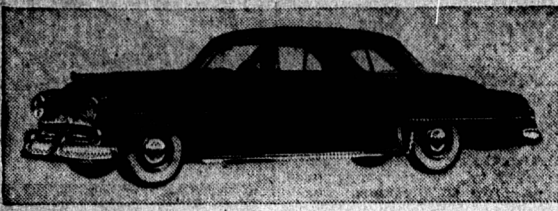


1951 Dodge Regent 4-Door Sedan

The organist was Mrs. Samuel Martin of Orwell.

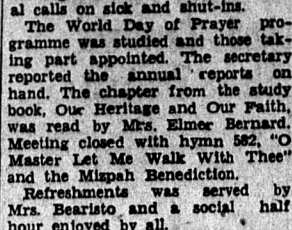
Benediction was pronounced by Mrs. John F. MacKay.
