NEW YORK (AP) — Ireland's Ron Delany literally ran Istvan Rozsavolgyi of Hungary into the boards Saturday night as he won his 21st indoor mile in a row in 4:03.7, just one-tenth of a second off the world indoor record.

Hayes Jones, a 19-year-old Eastern Michigan sophomore, won the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.1 seconds. Jones was just one-tenth of a second off the world's record of seven seconds held by Mit Campbell.
