*Magistrate's Court At Georgetown

*Stipendiary Magistrate Joseph W. MacDonald, J.C., held weekly court at the Court House in Georgetown on Thursday morning at 10.00 a.m. A resident of St. Andrew's School District pleaded guilty to a charge of stealing a double-bitted axe, on December 19th, 1949 at Mount Stewart. The article stolen was valued at \$3.00 and the charge was under Section 386 of the Criminal Code of Canada. A fine of \$10.00 and \$5.00 costs was imposed and in default the accused to serve one month in King's County Jail in Georgetown.


Mr. Everett "Tommy" Llewellyn left early in the week for New Glasgow, N. S., where he will visit with Mr. and Mrs. Judson Baker.


