AN INCREDIBLE REPORT.

Alleged Backdown of British Government

FROM ITS STRONG POSITION AS TO CHINA

Reported Triumph of Russian Diplomacy

JAPAN IN STATE OF CONSTERNATION.

Ten Thousand Russians on the Move.

Jan. 31.—The Daily Mail learns that China is inclined to make the best possible bargain with Russia whose diplomacy appears to have triumphed at Peking. England having resolved not to force a conflict by further opposing Russia's claim at Port Arthur and the Lien Tung peninsula.

Japan, says The Mail, has been thrown into a state of consternation by the British backdown and has adopted a more friendly attitude towards Russia.

This statement, however, The Mail admits is not incredible and possibly a bluff with the view of forcing England to take decisive steps.

The Mail counsels its readers not to be alarmed. The Berlin newspapers comment here is all to the text of England's inglorious retreat in the far east.

The National Gazette learns that Turkey has given Russia permission to send the Black Sea fleet through the Dardanelles.

LONDON, Jan. 31.—The Odessa correspondent of the Times says: A volunteer fleet will convey in the quickest time practicable over ten thousand Russians to the far east. The first cruiser with two thousand men will leave in a few days.

BRITISH FACILITIES.
Several Officers and Men Killed in India.

CALCUTTA, Jan. 31.—General Westmacott, telegraphs from Camp Mamamonic, that the fourth brigade became entangled in a gorge near Shamkarm, Saturday, and suffered serious losses. Lieutenant Colonel Houghton, Lieutenants Sweeney, Dowdan, Hughes, and Walder, together with fifteen men of the Yorkshire Light Infantry and three Sikhs were killed. Major Earle, Lieutenant Hall and 31 men of the Yorkshire's were wounded, Major Earle severely. The receipt of the despatch has caused a great sensation here.

A SHOCKING CRIME.
Jealous Woman Murders Her Sister.

ST. JOHN, Jan. 31.—A shocking crime is reported from Gore, near Johnsville, Carleton County. It appears that Mrs. Caneven came to the conclusion that her sister, Minnie Tucker, aged 21 years, was too intimate with her husband and she gave her a dose of strychnine from which she died. The woman has been arrested.

FATAL RAILWAY ACCIDENT.
Four Persons Killed—Thirty Injured.

BANGOR, Jan. 31.—A train on the Maine Central Railway left the track near here yesterday, killing four and injuring thirty persons. A. B. McLean, St. John, and Captain Carson, of St. Martin's, N. B., are among the wounded.

SITUATION IN LOWER EGYPT

The Dervishes Will Advance.
LONDON, Jan. 31.—A despatch from Wady, Halfa, says there are unconfirmed reports that the Dervishes under Osman Digna, have commenced an advance.

FISHING LICENSES.

The Modus Vivendi Renewed.

OTTAWA, Jan. 31.—An order in-council has been passed authorizing the issue of modus vivendi licenses to the United States fishing vessels in the waters of the Atlantic as has been in vogue for the last ten years.

Garrison Artillery Competitions.

OTTAWA, Jan. 31.—The garrison Artillery competitions will take place in St. John this year.

KINGSTON, Jan. 29.—The debate between Dr. Grant and Dr. Lucas was continued last night. Dr. Grant spoke first, comparing the case of Fredericton, N. B., with Berlin, Ont. The latter town is now under prohibition, yet the arrests in the latter town were only in the ratio of one to 160 in Fredericton. Sympathy with the Fredericton hotel-keepers was pointed out as evidence that public sentiment could not be depended on to enforce prohibition. The law should be felt to be the voice of God. Dr. Grant also urged that prohibition would tend to check immigration, as being an interference with personal liberty, unknown in the countries from which the bulk of the immigrants come.

Dr. Lucas answered Dr. Grant generally by a denial of the statements made by him. His own experiences in Kansas taught him that prohibition could be made to prohibit and that without damage to public morals.

TORONTO, Jan. 29.—A salt combine has been effected by the men controlling the price of Ontario salt. The result already is that salt is coming in from the United States.
