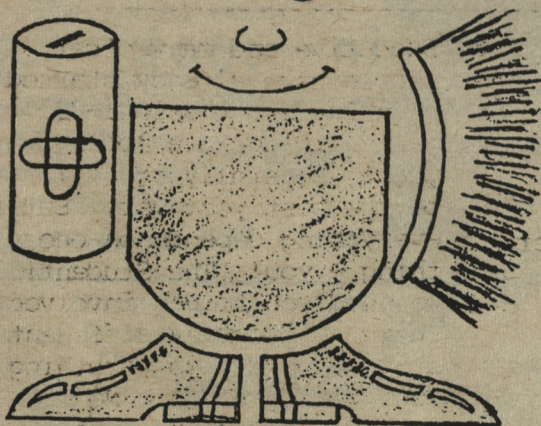


Shoeshine - Give a Dime

Hi there:

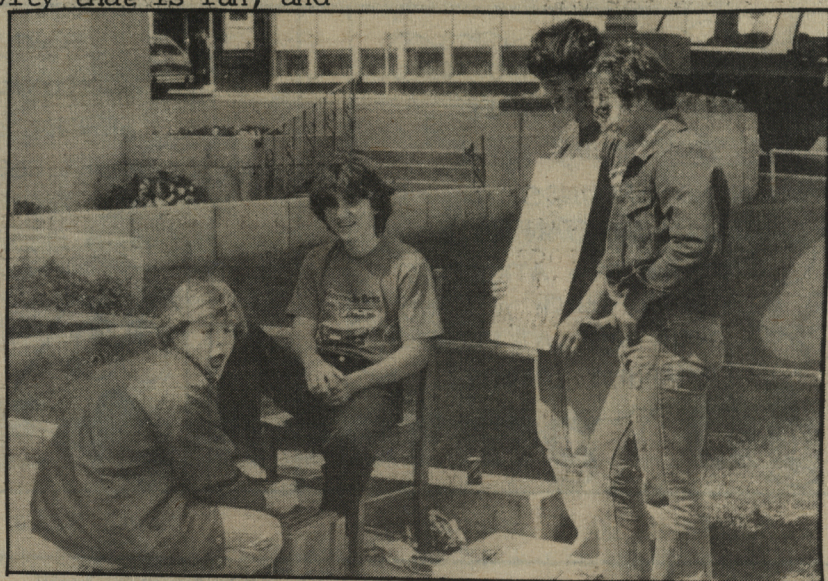
