Track And Field Meet To Be Held Here Labor Day

A Prince Edward Island track and field meet open to all contestants will be held at Memorial Field on Labor Day, Monday, September 6, it was announced here yesterday by Brigadier W. W. Reid of the Physical Fitness Department.

Among the features of the meet will be a six mile road race along with three bicycle races. The bicycle races will be of one-half mile, one mile and two-mile lengths.

Sponsors of the meet are the Physical Fitness Department and they will receive entries until midnight, August 31.

There will be age races for boys and girls from 8-10 years and from 11-13 years. Races for girls in the age groups will be held. There will also be a girls open 100 yard dash and a girls high jump.

Open events for the men include 100 yards and 440 yard dashes, the half mile and mile runs, the broad and high jumps, pole vault, hammer throw, shot put, discus and javelin throw.

The six mile road race will be held after supper.

The meet will get underway at 1:30 Daylight Time in the afternoon and is open to residents of the mainland as well as from this Province.

The kid was standing by the side of Diver Riggs canteen at Memorial Field and he was feeling kind of downhearted as all good baseball players do after losing a game when he murmured the words "If we had a Duck MacLeod we could beat them easy." The kid had changed from his baseball uniform to his civvies and he was making his way up to Diver's stand for a hot dog and a Pepsi after pitching a pretty good ball game. His name was Dee Lefurgey, a good junior pitcher who had beaten MacLeod in the opening game on Tuesday night and had come back to the mound on Sunday to lose to MacLeod.

Lefurgey's very brief sentence summed up the thoughts of most who lingered around the stand after the ball game. All were congratulating the kid for his performance on his masterful pitching and batting performance of the afternoon. He was the last boy to leave the dugout following the game and you almost had to look a second time to see him heading for the gate because he was surrounded by an army of kids.

"Duck" MacLeod was stamped as a baseball star from the moment he stepped into City League play as a kid of 12 years. That was five years ago. He developed gradually until this year when he started coming along like a house afire. He was at his peak on Sunday when he hurled a one-hitter, struck out 15 batters, hit a home run, double and single to drive in three runs in what was probably the greatest all-round performance ever given by a local ball player in Charlottetown.

It is possible that City baseball fans have seen Duck play his last game here this year. He along with Jackie Kane and Earl Nicolson will leave for Toronto on Saturday morning to take part in the Canadian Olympic Training Program which lasts for a week. The Abbies play in Summerside on Friday evening when coach Randy Edwards will start Duck again in an effort to put the Charlottetown team ahead three games to one in the series. By the time MacLeod and Kane return to the Province the series should be over.

Congratulations are extended to the Sunshine Island Dairy and their coach Jack Hennessey on winning the City Softball League championship. The Dairy were on top most of the way but during the last few weeks of play were closely pressed by Canada Packers and the Bike Shop Wheelers. The three teams battled down to the wire but the Dairy won out in the end by two points over their nearest competitors.

Only nine points separated the top six teams as the scheduled wound up last night. The Dairy had 32 points followed by Canada Packers with 30. The Bike Shop Wheelers had 28. 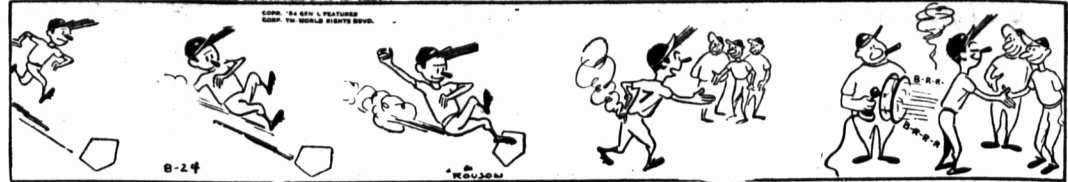
Kirkwood, who is presently performing at the Labatt Open in Toronto, has just played and performed at The World's Championship of Golf Tournament at Chicago.

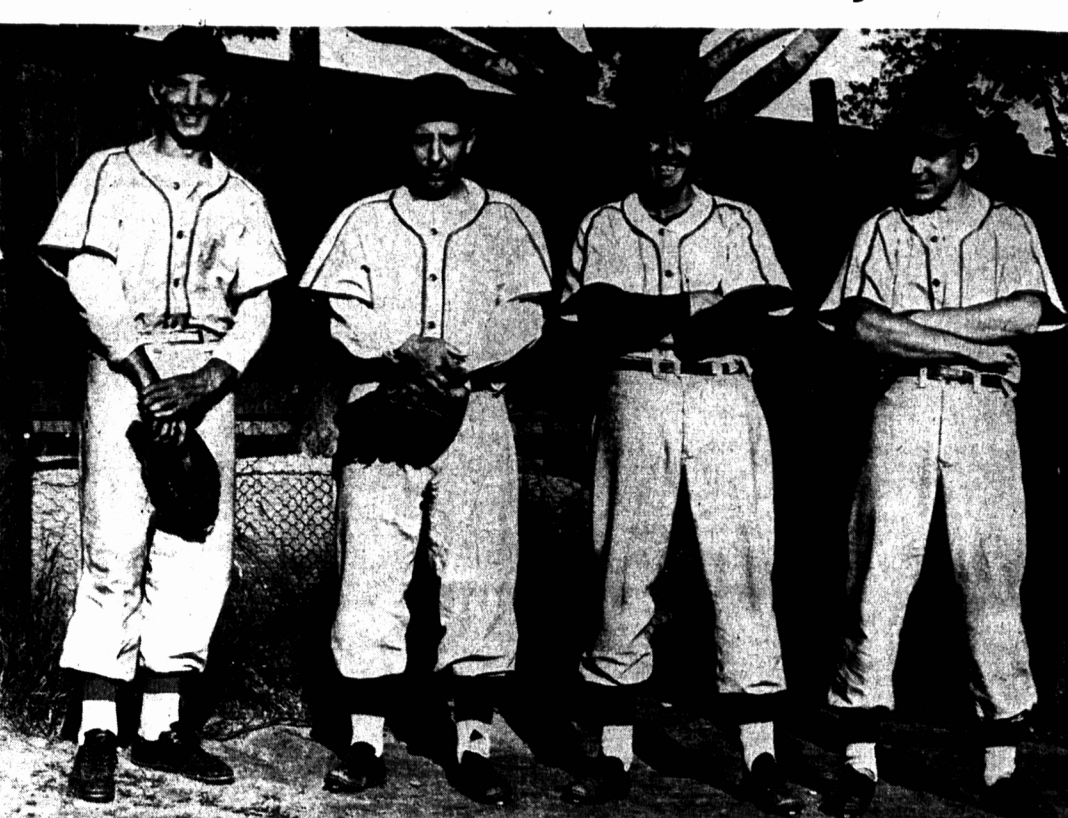
