West German Chancellor Pays First Visit To Canada

On the second morning he saw his chance and took it. Faced with a direct question regarding his supposed past, he reluctantly admitted loss of memory; and from the doctor's reaction to the admission, he realized that his groundwork had been good. It was evident that he had no suspicion of the truth, and the first and most tricky part of his plan had been accomplished.

Accompanied by his daughter, Lotte, Konrad Adenauer, at right, the West German chancellor is greeted by Prime Minister Louis St. Laurent following his arrival in Ottawa for a brief visit. The 77-year-old German leader, the first ever to visit Canada, received the full warmth of an official welcome even though his country is still technically not a sovereign state. Ottawa greeted him as a man who already has done much in the movement towards European unity and who is seen as the likeliest German to carry it further. In the capital to discuss trade and immigration following a visit to the U. S., Adenauer is admired and respected in the free world as an apostle of European unification, a foe of the bogus nationalism — as he calls it — which Hitler exploited, and a sturdy enemy of communism.

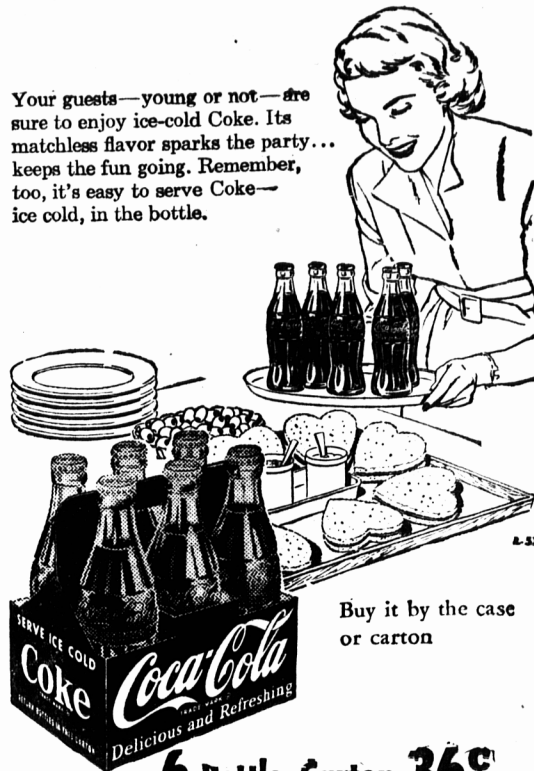
