Mrs. Camille Arseneault is convalescing at her home after undergoing major surgery in P.C. Hospital recently.

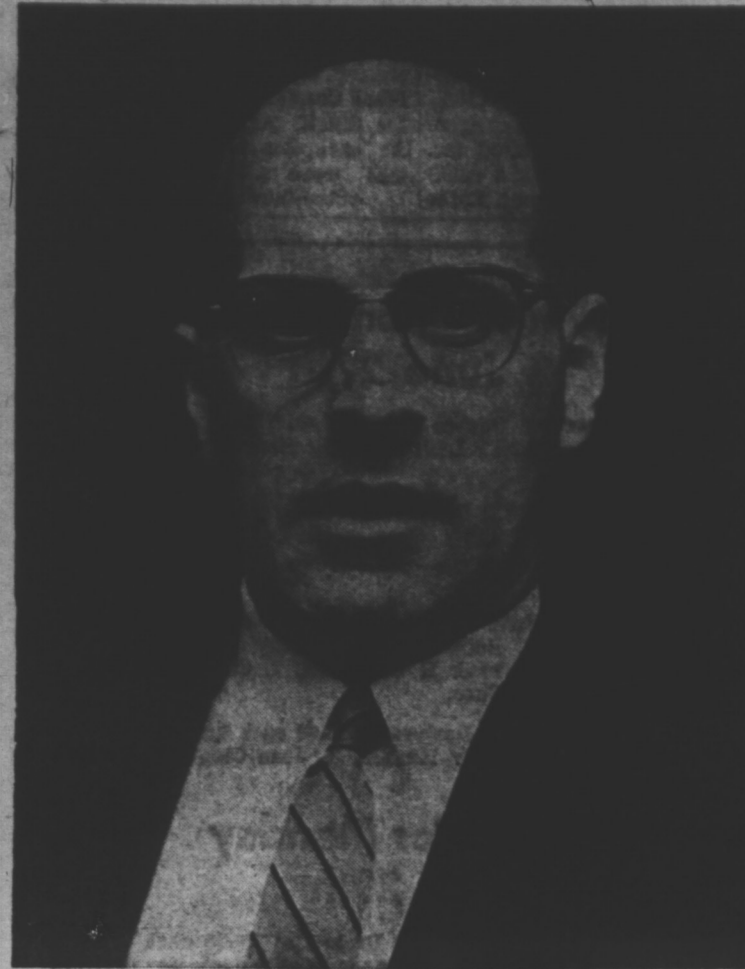

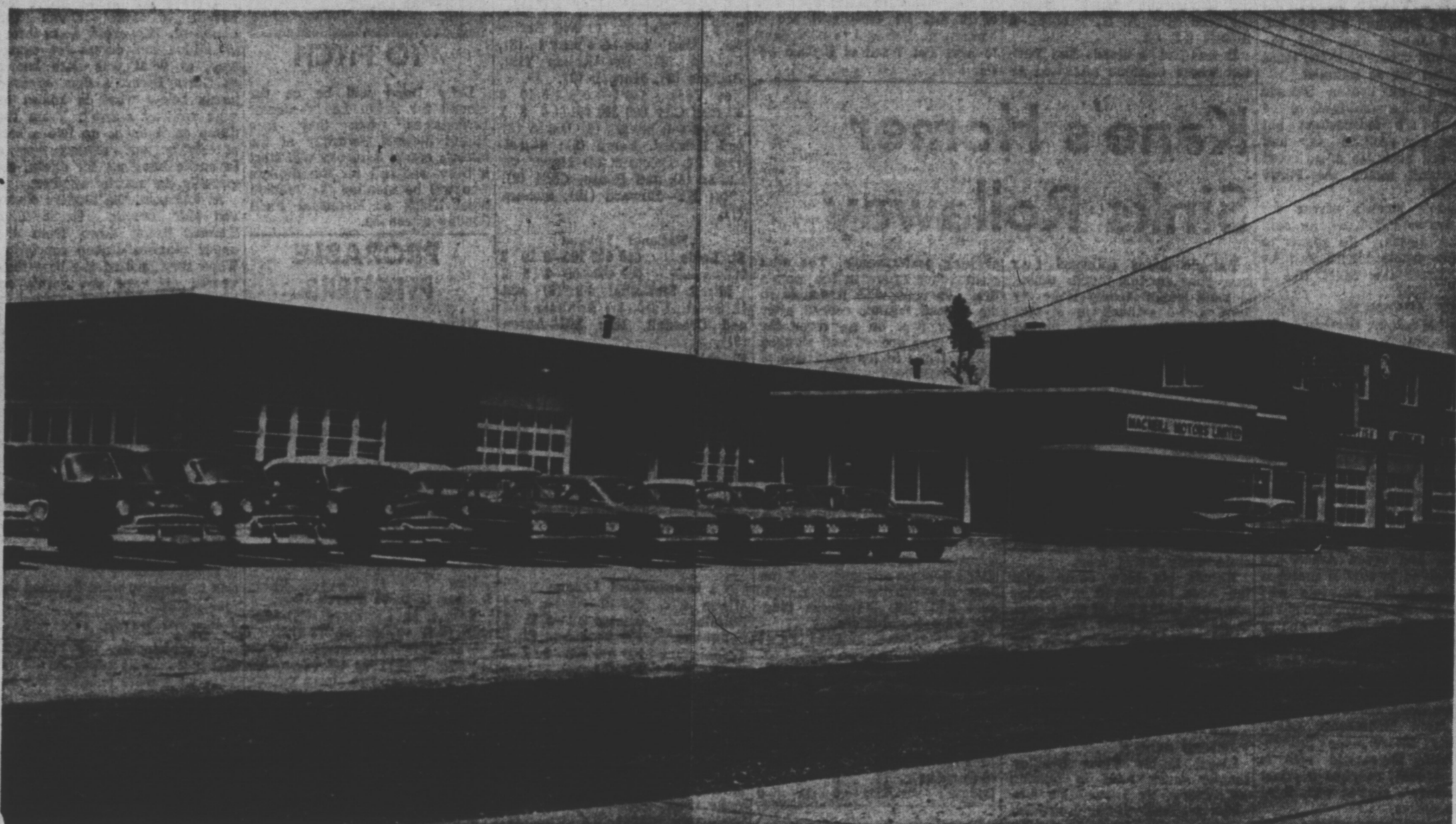
