

# Sweeping Nursing Changes Suggested By Commission

OTTAWA (CP) — Sweeping changes in nursing education and training are suggested by a commission on the future of nursing. The commission's report, which is being prepared by the Department of Health, says that the main reason for the changes is the need to create a pool of university-trained nurses to become instructors, supervisors, administrators and other leaders in the profession. Canada now has 14 university schools of nursing.

The new schools would be located at these universities: Victoria, Alberta (Calgary), Saskatchewan (Regina), Laurier (Ottawa), York (Toronto), Carleton (Ottawa), Laval (Quebec), Sherbrooke, Moncton and Memorial (St. John's).

The commission, in its report to the government, says that as many as 42,000 nurses will have to be recruited in Canada between now and 1971, of these, approximately 20 to 25 per cent should be university graduates.

As part of a seven-year crash program, the commission says that grants of \$2,500 to be made available to the 10 registered nurses wishing to obtain university qualifications.

To direct the drastic changes in nursing education it recommends the commission propose establishment in each province of a nursing education planning committee.

In order to make hospital schools of nursing "wholly educational in their function," the commission says budgets of hospitals now operated by the province should be separated from the regular nursing service budgets.

To encourage more women to enter the profession, it says "salaries commensurate with the training and responsibilities of nurses" and comparable with those in similar fields should be paid by federal and provincial agencies and by hospitals.

# Quebec Mayors Plan Effort At Understanding

PIERREVILLE, Que. (CP) — The Quebec Union of Municipalities announced today a campaign of "mutual understanding between the country's two ethnic groups" to begin with a study session by Quebec mayors next fall in Victoria.

Meeting in this municipality 60 miles northeast of Montreal, the board of directors of the union praised the mayor of the B.C. capital.

Victoria Mayor R. B. Wilson greeted Quebec representatives in French when they visited his city after the last convention of the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities in Regina, union president Robert Cauchon of Salaberry-de-Valleyfield, Que., remarked.

As a gesture of appreciation to Mayor Wilson, the union's directors decided to make the first of the group's outside-the-province study sessions in British Columbia.

"It is a tradition for the Quebec Union of Municipalities to hold study sessions each year after its convention," said Mayor Cauchon. "We wanted to kill two birds with one stone by helping other provinces understand us better while we get to know them."

The union's convention will be held in Quebec City at the end of September.

The Pierreville session of the union board of directors was also marked by a visit from Quebec Lieutenant-Governor Paul Comtois, a former Pierreville resident, and the formation of a committee to cooperate with the Quebec Association of Police and Fire Chiefs which recently called for closer relations with municipalities.

# Joey Praises Health Report

CORNER BROOK, Nfld. (CP) — Premier Smallwood said here Sunday the report of the royal commission on health services is "just what the doctor ordered for Newfoundland." He said it was "a magnificent report."

Mr. Smallwood said if the recommendations of the commission are carried out it would be a great help to Newfoundland which has spent much money in recent years to improve health services.

Meanwhile, in a statement issued in St. John's Sunday, the Newfoundland Medical Association said it properly conceived and administered prepaid medical plan would meet with the support of the main body of Canadian doctors.

The association said, however, certain assurances would have to be made to safeguard standards and quality of medical service before doctors are asked to accept such a plan.

The Newfoundland Federation of Labor, which submitted a lengthy brief to the commission when it visited St. John's, also approved the commission's recommendations.

President Esau Thoms said the commission's recommendations on a medical service could give to non-cottage hospital areas of Newfoundland the same type of service received in cottage hospitals.

The vessel, largest of its type to be built in this area, will cost \$1,768,000 and construction is expected to start shortly after the contract is signed.

To be named Royal Scarab, the vessel will be sister ship to the smaller Golden Scarab, now under construction at the George T. Davie yard in Quebec City.

Mr. Ryall said the ship will take about one year to build. She will fish for tuna off the Nova Scotia coast.
