SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER. BRITISH PARLIAMENT. McCarthy Asks For Names. A Very Lively Scene. LONDON, April 10. During the session of the House of Commons yesterday Justin McCarthy asked when the Government would give the names of those selected to sit on the Royal Labor Commission, and in reply Smith said that the question would be answered on Monday next. There was a lively scene in the House last night, caused by Timothy Healy assaulting Nolan and Russel for supporting the Government against a quibbling amendment to a land bill. The speaker had to call the men to order. THE TRADE QUESTION. Date of Conference Fixed. OTTAWA, April 10. The Ministers of Justice and Finance returned from Washington last afternoon. Shortly after their arrival a despatch was received from Sir Julian Pauncefote, the British Minister at Washington, stating that Monday, Oct 12, had been decided upon as the date of the conference between the representatives of Canada and the United States on trade matters. This prompt action on the part of the United States is a very effectual answer to the Canadian manufacturers of the Washington specials of the past few days, and both ministers have expressed themselves as being well pleased with the courtesy received at Washington.
