Nationally, there are 51 teams that promote the importance of entrepreneurship and market economics. The local team at the University of Prince Edward Island was founded in April of 2004 and, in their first year, won "Best Start-Up" and has been in the Top 10 in both 2005 and 2006.

Since then, they have created a strong following of members on campus which they are currently looking to build. As their first project of the year, ACE has put together the Campus Discount Card which is can be used at over twenty businesses around Charlottetown and can be purchased for \$10.
