General Telegraphic News.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23.—Word has reached the state department of serious trouble in Colombia in consequence of the quarantine established against American and English vessels.

OTTAWA, Sept. 23.—A London cable says: The status of Sir John A. Macdonald, which is to grace parliament hall, Ottawa, a tribute to the departed statesman, will soon be in the skillful hands of sculptor Wade.

LONDON, September 23.—At a meeting in Dublin of both factions of the nationalist members of the corporation, it was resolved by a vote of 17 to 6 not to present an address to the Viceroy, Lord Houghton, upon his entering the city.

OTTAWA, Sept. 23.—Mr. Andrew Fleck, of the Vulcan Iron Works, has shipped to Perth, Ont., an enormous cheese mould, nine feet in diameter by seven feet in height.
