NEW HOPE SEEN FOR CEASE-FIRE TRUCE IN KOREA

Toronto Housewife Succeeds In Channel Swim

First Canadian Woman To Accomplish Feat

DOVER, England, Aug. 16 (CP) — A Toronto housewife tonight became the first Canadian woman ever to swim the English Channel when she finished second in the £7,000 Daily Mail race.

Winnie Roach Leuzler, 25-year-old mother of three children, survived chilling waters and a back-breaking pace to cross the 21 miles from Cap Griz Nez, France to the Dover beaches in 13 hours and 45 minutes, beating Gertrude Ederle's mark of 14 hours, 31 minutes — a record that stood for 24 years until it was broken last year.

Mrs. Leuzler will receive £500 second prize.

A field of 20 swimmers — 13 men and seven women — took part in the gruelling race.

One Minute Apart

Hassan Hamad, 34-year-old Egyptian, won the men's first prize of £1,000 by finishing only one minute ahead of Roger Le Morvan of France.

Hamad touched bottom, climbed over some boulders and clambered ashore at Shakespeare Cliff after 12 hours and 12 minutes in the water.

Le Morvan, who won \$500 for second, waded out four miles to the east in St. Margaret's Bay.

Mrs. Leuzler and the six other women plunged into the choppy green waters off the French coast at 7:30 A.M. this morning.
