West dealer.
North-South vulnerable.

The bidding:
West North East South
1♥ Pass 2♥ 3♠
Pass 3♥ Pass 3♠

Opening lead—queen of clubs. It sometimes happens that declarer, in a suit contract, loses control of trumps for the simple reason that he does not have enough of them to start with. To overcome this shortage of trumps is generally a delicate proposition, but that it can be done is shown by this deal.

North-South arrived at an ambitious four spade contract on the bidding sequence shown. West chose the queen of clubs as his opening lead and, favorable as it was, declarer still had a tough row to hoe.

He won the club with the king and led a low spade to the ten. West took the ace, played the ace of hearts, and continued with

Reds Buying Tardy On Wheat

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada might have hit its wheat export target of 300,000,000 bushels in the crop year just ended if Russia had been more prompt in making the wheat purchase it promised. Officials say the crop year ended July 31 without Russia taking delivery of half of the 14,800,000 bushels it agreed to buy in the closing year of a three-year trade pact that expired earlier this year.

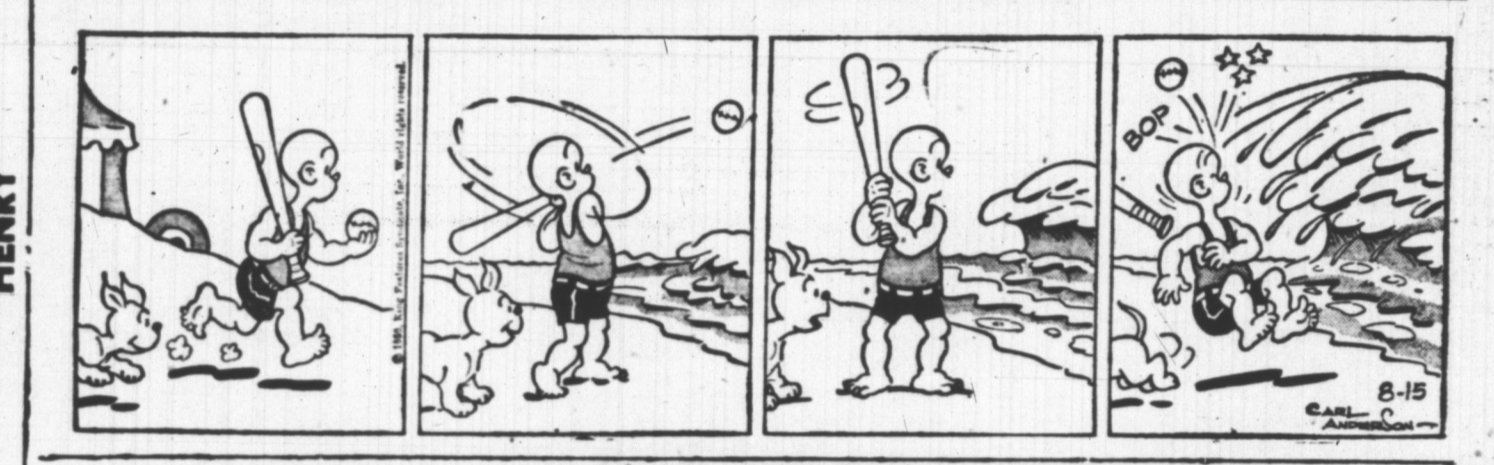
Meanwhile, Trade Minister Churchill, without referring to the Soviet shortfall, said in an interview that wheat exports won't be more than 7,000,000 bushels short of the 300,000,000-bushel target.

Officials say they aren't concerned about Russia taking delivery of the rest of its wheat contract. Canadian wheat board chairman W. C. McNamara has said it is just a question of when Soviet ships can take delivery.

TALKS GO ON
Negotiations are continuing here on a new trade agreement with Russia, but with no apparent signs of Soviet willingness to bind themselves to future wheat purchases.

That tariff treatment is being continued on a temporary basis during the current negotiations.

In another field of interest to Canada's wheat growers, talks are going ahead in an effort to implement the new Canadian proposal to make a \$10,000,000 gift of flour to Europe.
