Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP)—Earlier gains wilted under selling pressure in heavy closing trading Friday and the stock market closed lower on index. Gains and losses, however, were about balanced.

For most of the day, the market was one of "speculative buying." Pivotal stocks moved in a two-point change, most changes on the upside. But a few minutes before the close, losses poured across the board but in narrow range.

The base metal index had the greater loss, nearly a point. Western oils were off three-quarters of a point on their index and industrials just less than one-half point. Golds added nine decimal points.

A large portion of the activity was again in the speculative mining section. Volumes of 500,000 or more were recorded by a few stocks but the price changes were not great. Pronto Uranium had the best gain in the mines, adding 40 cents. Losses were 15 cents or less.

Central Leduc dipped 30 cents in the easier western oil section, other losses were 15 cents or less.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP)—Most industrial sections were hit by losses Friday in moderate trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.

Banks were an exception as Royal jumped 1 1/2 and Commerce a point. Calgary Power formed 1 among utilities. Base metals eased as Noranda lost 1 and International Nickel 1/2.

Petroleum dropped 1 1/2 while other refining oils were mixed in minor fractions. A quiet steel group showed Algoma down a point and Stelco 1 1/2. Papers gave away 2 1/2. Price 1 1/2 and Vowell, River 2 1/2 and beverage and confectionery were firm.

Among western oils Bailey Selburn added a cent and Canadian 15 cents. Mines were irregularly better.

The exchanges' closing average show banks up .36 at a new high of 55.99, utilities up 0.1 at 140.0, industrials off 1.8 at 243.1, commodities off 1.8 at 247.4, papers off 15.33 at a new low of 1379.56 and golds up 0.43 at 74.05.

N. Y. STOCKS

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market, battered down in a late wave of selling, took its worst beating Friday since Oct. 31, the day of the British-French attack on Egypt.
