FRENCH ABBES STATEMENT:

**Anti-Christ Was Born in 1854—Will
 Begin Work in 1907.**

PARIS, March 24.—The Abbe Sonier, a Christian Kabbalist of considerable renown, has just written to the Revue Gaulois:

"Here is the result of my researches. The near future will show whether I am deceived in my calculations or not. (1) A king of France, a Bourbon, ought to remount the throne of his fathers in the year of grace, 1899. (2) The Turkish Empire will be destroyed by this king in 1900. (3) The Anti-Christ, who is now living unknown, and who, according to the most diverse calculations and prophecies, ought to have been conceived in sin on the same day that the Virgin Mary was proclaimed 'conceived without sin,' December 8, 1854, will commence his persecutions against the church at the end of the year 1907. He will die in 1911."

After the fall of the first Anti-Christ, Mahomet, the second, who is Antemus the Beast of the Apocalypse, is to come. With his kabbalistic calculations the venerated H. L. L. was able to fix on the very year of the nineteenth century in which he must be born. Taking the last verse of the thirteenth chapter of the Revelation for a guide.

"Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the Beast, for it is the number of a man, and his number is six hundred threescore and six."—The learned commentator wrote in the year 1658.

"This number 666 is the number of months that in 56 1/2 years; that is to say, the number of years of the Beast, the epoch of his birth and the duration of his life. Therefore in the middle of the year 1854 in the nineteenth century, which shall have seen the fall of Mahomet, the Anti-Christ Antemus shall be born and live 56 1/2 years. It is in the last three years of his life, and particularly the last six months, that he will fight with the greatest fury against the Christians. With the help of the false prophets he will exterminate the church, disperse the flock of the Lord, and will force himself on every tribe and every people. Then after the year 1911, his days shall be finished, and the son of perdition shall be slain in the fifty-sixth year of his life by a breath, by a word issuing from the mouth of an innocent child."

Situation in Jamaica.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, March 25.—The discussion by the Legislative Assembly of a measure providing for an increase in the tariff, rendered necessary by the colony's financial crisis, was indefinitely adjourned last Wednesday in consequence of the hostile action of the elected members of the Assembly, whose opposition made the passage of the bill an impossibility. Today the Governor, Sir Augustus Hemming, issued a proclamation dissolving the Assembly, and stating that, under the advice of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, he would augment the official element in the new Assembly to force the tariff bill through.

The present constitution of Jamaica has been in force for fifteen years, but this is the first time the Government has availed itself of the power conferred on it to dissolve the Legislature and add to the nominated members of the Assembly.

The Governor, Sir Augustus Hemming, reconvened the Assembly today, at the same time bringing in four new official members to cultivate the representatives. The Jamaica Association has convened public meetings throughout the country, and it has cabled to Mr. Chamberlain explaining the gravity of the situation. Considerable excitement prevails, and it is said that there will be trouble if the Government persists in its policy.

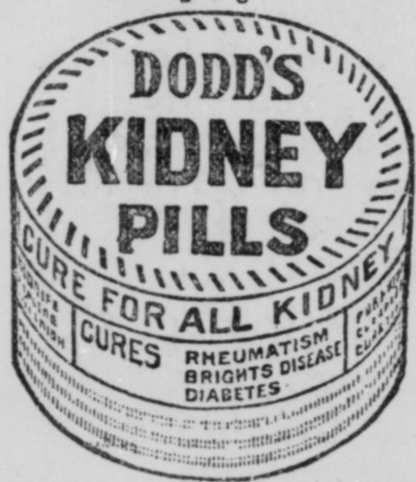
Another Change.
