### GABLE AND GARDNER, AT CAPITOL, SUMMERSIDE

### Youth Arrested In Twin Murder

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (AP)—An 18-year-old youth, who was a pallbearer at her funeral, was taken into custody Friday in connection with the savage knife slayings of baby-sitter Lynn Ann Smith and her four-year-old boy charge. District attorney Stephen A. Moynahan said Kenneth Chapin, who lives around the corner from the slain girl, "has given us a statement definitely implicating him" in the Sept. 25 slaying. Moynahan said the youth will be arraigned today on a murder charge.

### Lease on Life for Kidnap - Rapist

SAN FRANCISCO, (AP)—Convicted kidnap-rapist Caryl Chessman has another tenuous lease on life through another legal victory in his six-year fight to avoid the gas chamber.

The California Supreme Court Thursday refused to vacate the stay of execution one of its members granted the 32-year-old author of "Cell 2455, Death Row" July 29, the eve of his most recent date with death.

That means Chessman's case is again in the hands of the Supreme Court of the United States, and he cannot be executed until at least 60 days after that tribunal acts. Chessman's lawyer, Berwyn Rice, said the high court may consider the case Wednesday.

### Clergy Frown On "The Fourposter"

OTTAWA (CP)—The Broadway success "The Fourposter," planned as the season-opener for the Canadian Repertory Theatre group here Oct. 15, has come under the ban of a Church censor because of its "risque" approach. A CRT spokesman said Thursday the group is "searching frantically" for a new play for the opening, usually attended by the governor-general.

The ban was put on "The Fourposter" by Rev. John A. MacDonald, appointed by the Roman Catholic Church to review and censor all plays staged by CRT at LaSalle Academy, a Roman Catholic institution. A clause was inserted in the CRT's rental contract giving the Church the right of censorship.

Father MacDonald was out of town and unavailable for comment. "The Fourposter" concerns a married couple and an old bed. The entire production is staged in the couple's bedroom.

### Life Measured In Service To God

GLACE BAY, N. S. (CP)—Life is not measured in years but in service to God and man. T. K. MacLellan of Halifax said Wednesday at the Maritime synod of the Presbyterian Church.

Mr. MacLellan spoke on Christian stewardship. Referring to the \$1,100 budget, he said it is only \$6 a year for each of the 181,270 members of the church or 11 1/2 cents a week. Although many give 20 times this amount, the average for the Maritime synod was only \$8.34 last year. "This is because all Presbyterians are not practising stewardship."

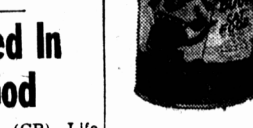

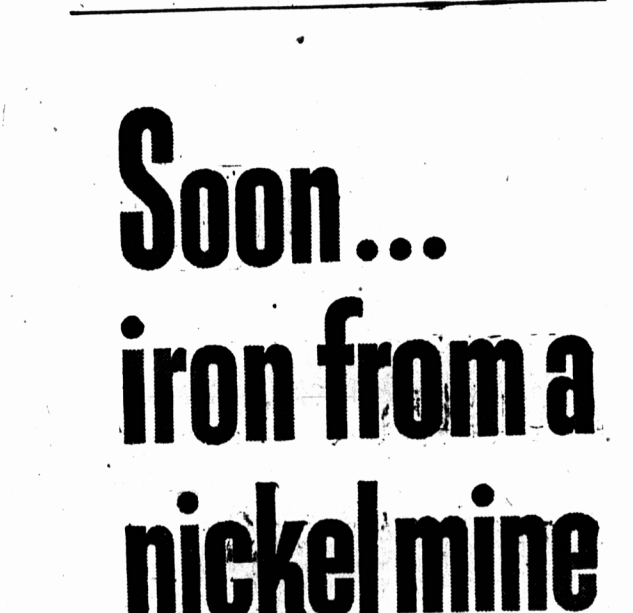
