TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR INSURED SERVICES THE APPLICANT MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS-

- 1. - THE APPLICANT MUST QUALIFY AS A RESIDENT
2. - THE HOSPITAL SERVICE MUST BE MEDICALLY NECESSARY
3. - THE HOSPITAL CARE PROVIDED MUST BE AN INSURED SERVICE
