## IN ONTARIO

PROSPECTS BRIGHT FOR CONSERVATIVES.

The People Will Not Vote For Tarte.

(SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.)

TORONTO, Nov. 5.—The political outlook from the Conservative standpoint, is brighter in Ontario than ever before. Every doubtful seat will go Conservative, and what the Conservatives have they will hold. That is the situation in a nutshell.

Conservative organizers here declare that the next House will see a majority of at least 22 Conservative members from Ontario. Many considerations go to make up this estimate. Ontario is strongly Protestant. The Remedial Bill in 1896 played havoc with party lines. That is now a dead issue, and parties are lining up as never before. But Ontario is also Conservative. The provincial election of 1898 was so narrow a squeak for Premier Ross that he might have said "another such victory and I am done."

The adoption of the provincial franchise played into the hands of the Conservatives.

Of all the issues of the campaign that one that presents Tarte as favorable to Canada's separation from the Empire is having the greatest weight here.

Tarte's attitude on the contingent question, his speech in France, and his equally indiscreet utterances in Canada, all militate against the Liberal canvass, and at public meetings in Ontario, when Tarte's name is mentioned, it is hissed. Local papers appear with headlines "A vote for Sir Charles is a vote against Tarte."

Altogether it looks in Ontario like a landslide for the Conservatives. Among the seats the Conservative organizers are confident they will win are Brockville, Cornwall, Stormont West, Durham, South Essex, Frontenac, North Grey, Hamilton (2) W Huron, Kingston, East Lambton, Leeds, Grenville, North Ontario, North Middlesex, Centre Toronto and Centre Wellington.

SIR CHARLES TUPPER.

His Campaign in Cape Breton.

SYDNEY, Nov. 5.—Sir Charles Tupper arrived here by the late train on Friday night from Montreal. He spent Saturday morning in conference with the local Conservative leaders, and in the afternoon went out to Glace Bay. That evening he addressed a large political meeting at Bridgeport, returning to Glace Bay afterwards. On Sunday he stayed at Glace Bay and to-day he goes to Baddeck where he will address meetings. He will return on Tuesday to Sydney and will remain in Sydney till the election is over.

WORK FOR EXILED BOERS.

Dr. Leyds Sends Out an Appeal to the Employers of Holland.

ANTWERP, Nov. 3.—Dr. Leyds, European representative of the Transvaal Government, has issued a proclamation throughout Holland, urging employers to take into their employ distressed Boers driven from their country by Lord Roberts. Dire misery reigns here among the Boer families thus expelled or transported by the British Government. Some of them are all but starving.

## WORKINGMEN

PROMISED HIGHER WAGES

If The Opposition Wins.

(SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.)

MONTREAL, Nov. 5.—Much interest was created in labor circles on Saturday night by the reading of a letter to delighted thousands of working men.

It was read by Mr. M. J. F. Quinn and signed by the largest industrial firm in its line in Canada.

The letter is placed in the safe keeping of the Montreal Trust and Deposit Company, to be opened the day after the elections and made public if the Conservatives win.

The lead taken by this firm must, in the event of victory for the Conservatives, be followed by a great number of firms. The announcement was received with applause. The letter is as follows:

MONTREAL, October 27, 1900.

To M. J. F. Quinn, Esq.:

Dear Sir,—In reply to your enquiry, we beg to say that we are under the impression that the workingmen of Canada will find a vast improvement in their condition if the Conservative party be returned to power. The uncertain movements of the Liberal party, their shifting policy, and the feeling of insecurity which this engenders, make trade matters doubtful under any policy the Liberals may for the moment adopt. This is always injurious not only to employers but employe. If there was in power a party that could be depended upon for a stable trade policy the workingmen of Canada will have a share in the industrial boom that the whole world is experiencing. The hands in our establishment are largely made of skilled labor, and provided the Conservatives are returned to power our intention is to give an immediate advance to our working people; and this step is of such a character that it is certain to be followed in many parts of the Dominion, and will, no doubt, become general. You will be permitted to compare this promise with our performance after the Conservatives are returned to power.

In making this letter public we must request that until after the election you withhold our name, as in some quarters it may be sought to convey the impression that we were trying to directly influence the votes of our employes. I may tell you, however, that such a course has never been pursued by us. The coming of the Conservatives undoubtedly means better wages for the workingmen right away. So the workingmen will have a real interest, not a sham interest as now, in the works of prosperity.
