Enquiry Before Privileges and Election Committee

STOPPED BY GOVERNMENT MA- JORITY.

Recommended that Enquiry be Con-
tinued Next Session.

OTTAWA, Aug. 8.—A sub committee, consisting of Messrs. Russell and Borden of the House Committee on Privileges and Elections, have agreed upon a report which will be presented to the full committee this morning.

It will simply report the evidence as taken without any finding thereon.

It will state further that, owing to the inquiry being incomplete because of the limited time at the committee's disposal, and inability to secure the attendance of Farr and other material witnesses, it is recommended that the enquiry be continued next session.

In the meantime, Judge Mason is to be appointed a commissioner to take evidence of the remaining witnesses of poll No. 3 in the town of Goderich. The Government majority forced this conclusion and stopped the enquiry, against Mr. Borden's protest.
