TO BE REMEMBERED.

HERE is a record of the expenditures on ordinary or consolidated account, since 1896 (the last year of Conservative rule) the year in each case ending with June 30:

1896	\$36,949,142
1897	38,349,760
1898	38,832,526
1899	41,760,342
1900	42,987,549

There has been, in the four years since the Laurier Government came into power, an increase in the outlays of the administration of six millions a year.

The outlays on capital account have been in proportion. Here are the figures:

1896	\$3,781,311
1897	3,523,160
1898	4,142,231
1899	9,639,142
1900	9,726,260

There has been an increase in this department of the expenditure in the last year of the Liberal, as compared with the last year of the Conservative Government, of close upon six millions a year.

Fourteen millions more were collected from the people in 1900 than in 1896. Here are the figures, taken from the public accounts, and Mr. Fiddling's address at Halifax:

1896	\$36,618,590
1897	37,829,778
1898	40,556,510
1899	46,743,102
1900	50,927,941

Most of the increase came out of taxation, as is shown by the figures of the customs and inland revenue collections.

1896	\$27,757,285
1897	28,648,626
1898	29,576,455
1899	34,958,069
1900	38,242,223

This means that the rate of taxation has increased under the Laurier Government from \$5.42 to \$7.51 a head, or from \$27.10 to \$37.67 a fam.

To vote for the Ex-Attorney General is to vote disregard for the British constitution, as well as endorsement of all the acts of the late-Laurier government.

In explanation of his strange conduct, viz, nominating as Liberal-Conservative candidate in Victoria, New Brunswick, on Wednesday afternoon and retiring on Thursday morning, Mr. Richards merely says that his wife dissuaded him from continuing the contest. Hundreds of electors who wished to cast honest ballots for honest government wish that Mrs. Richards had chosen an earlier and more opportune moment for exercising her persuasive powers upon her husband.

To vote for Hughes is to express satisfaction with the large increase of the public expenditures and debt!

THE Montreal Star remarks that "the present political campaign will go on record as a good-humored contest. Few personalities," it says, "have been indulged in, and these only by persons of very little responsibility." While this is true in general, we repeat that an exception is found in this Province in the Patriot. Its unwarranted attack upon Mr. Stewart, after the Market Hall meeting, is to be regretted, and, most of all, by Sir Louis Davies.

The day has gone by when a candidate can hope to win an election by brow-beating his opponent.

—Montreal Gazette: Mr. W. W. B. McInnes, who won Nainaimo, B. C., from the Conservatives in 1896, and who was so favored by the Government that he was selected to move the reply to the speech from the throne in the House of Commons, is the latest Pacific Coast dissident. He has been declaring on the platform that the Laurier Government proved itself false to every promise it made, implying that it will be best for Liberalism that it should be destroyed by the electors. Tartéism and Siftonism and Blairism and Bordenism have divided the Liberal house against itself, and a house divided against itself cannot stand.

### STILL A CONSERVATIVE.

Liberal newspapers having reported that James S. Neill, of Fredericton, N. B., president of the Conservative Association of York County, had joined the Liberal party, Mr. Neill was interviewed by the Fredericton Gleaner. He said: "The statement that I have resigned as president of the York County Liberal-Conservative Association is only partially true. For purely business reasons I asked two years ago to be relieved of the duties of president of the association. The association did not comply with my request, and has not yet done so. The statement that I am actively supporting the Liberals is not true. There is no word of truth in it. I have always been Conservative, and now Conservative, and intend to vote for that party." The same papers that published the false report about Mr. Neill recently published a statement to the effect that Mr. J. P. Murray, of the Toronto Carpet Manufacturing Company, was satisfied with the Laurier Government. Mr. Murray most emphatically contradicted the statement, and gave some very good reasons why the manufacturers of Canada had reason to desire the return of the Conservatives to power. So many prominent Liberals have announced their intention of voting against the Laurier Government that the Liberal newspapers are trying to find Conservatives who are willing to have their names associated with those of Sifton, Blair and Tarté, and endorse the Drummond County deal, the maladministration of the Yukon Territory, the Emergency Ration scandal, the Tarté dredging contracts, the Blair oil purchases, and the ballot-box stuffing frauds of the Laurier Administration.—Star.
