Appointments Announced

LEAMINGTON, Ont., Dec. 13.—Appointment of F. T. Sherk as executive vice-president of H. J. Heinz Company of Canada Ltd., was announced today by H. J. Heinz II, president of the International House of Heinz. Mr. Sherk succeeds L. M. Melius of Pittsburgh, Pa., who continues as a director of the International House of Heinz and also as a director of H. J. Heinz Company of Canada Ltd.

L. D. Crimp, formerly sales manager of the Canadian company Sales Promotion and Advertising Manager P. E. Gervais is promoted to Mr. Crimp's former job and

Richard Loftus to that held by Mr. Gervais.

Mr. Heinz also announced that the company's sales headquarters, now located in Toronto, will be moved to Leamington January 1, 1952, the date on which the appointments become effective.

Mr. Sherk's appointment to head H. J. Heinz Company of Canada marks a further step in a policy adopted some years ago to make the Canadian company autonomous. In addition, the appointment provides an example of the company's policy of promotion from within.

Frank Sherk began working for the Heinz Company in 1919 at the age of 15 as an hourly paid worker in the Leamington factory. Nine years later, he was transferred to department in Hamilton, Toronto and Timmins before returning to Toronto in 1932. Following several promotions within the sales department, he was elected a director of the Canadian company in 1949. A few months later he was appointed general sales manager for Canada.

Mr. Crimp, a native of Vancouver, has been with the company since 1925. He served as a member of the sales department in various capacities in Vancouver, Toronto, Winnipeg and Montreal before becoming eastern sales manager in 1949.

Mr. Gervais began his Heinz career in Montreal in 1932 and served there until his appointment as sales promotion and advertising manager in 1949. Mr. Loftus joined Heinz in Hamilton in 1937 and has represented the company in St. Catharines, Winnipeg and Montreal. Until his appointment he was manager of baby food sales with headquarters in Toronto.

THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT

Your attention is directed to the following provisions of the said Act:

SECTION 66

SUB-SECTION (4)

Where any work within the scope of this Part is undertaken by a contractor or contractors, the person for whom such work is undertaken shall, within seven days after the making of any such contract notify the Board in writing of the making of such contract or contracts and in such notice shall state:

(a) the name and address of the contractor or contractors;

(b) The nature of the work to be performed by the contractor or contractors;

(c) the amount payable under the contract, whether a lump sum or in proportion to the amount of work done, and in the latter case give the full particulars;

(d) the probable length of time for completion of the work to be performed by the contractor or contractors.
