NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market continued to make up its losses Monday despite weak spots.

Steels had the benefit of industry reports that demand remained strong in spite of the strike at General Motors, now in its fourth week. New steel production was higher.

Stocks of the major steel-makers produced a price advance of moderate gains; but all of the big three auto stocks reported declines. Chrysler, which reported on earnings and dividends Tuesday, lost 1/2 at 39 1/2. Ford rose 1/4 at 40.

Coppers enjoyed another rally following news the price for spot copper in London had soared to a record of \$1.07 1/2.

The Dow Jones Industrial average advanced 2.67 to 876.21. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 1 1/4 to a record 328 1/2.

Losers outnumbered gainers by eight to six on the list of most active stocks, with first-child health stocks, with Texas Gulf Sulphur led 1 1/4.

Among Canadian issues, the traded, Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagrams each rose 1/4.

Prices were generally higher on the American Exchange and Canadian markets. Dow Jones Down 1/4 each were Jupiter Corp. and Scurry Rainbow Oil.
