# Local and Other Items

**NEWCASTLE INCORPORATED.**—The town of Newcastle, N. B., decided for incorporation at the election on Thursday by a vote of 246 to 83 and will soon be under town government. Other towns in the province will follow suit.

**A WORD IN SEASON.**—Medical science has discovered that the use of strawberries sometimes produces on the human jaw the effect of entirely arresting its activities. The disability is a curious one, marking out the strawberry as a possible agent of relief in cases of obstinate volubility, domestic and public. **METHODIST ECUMENICAL COUNCIL.**—A conference of the western section of the Methodist world, which comprises the United States and Canada, North and South America, having in view a meeting of the Methodist Ecumenical Council, to be held in London in the fall of 1901, held a meeting in New York last week. Bishop B. C. Galloway, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, was chosen temporary chairman. Bishop John F. Hurst, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Washington, was selected permanent chairman of the western section, and the Rev. John J. Tigert, of Nashville, Tenn., was elected permanent secretary. The Rev. A. Carman, of Toronto, was elected a member of the executive committee. Much business of a routine character was transacted and the plan for the great London meeting in 1901 well started.

**DANCED ON RIVAL'S PICTURE.**—A Chicago despatch says: John Bernhaupt lies in the County Hospital with both feet bound in bandages, and the lockjaw. Between groans he chides himself and vows that if he ever again dances on a rival's face he will put his shoes on. Mrs. Bernhaupt was a charming widow when John married her not long ago, and ever since that happy day she has never overlooked a chance to tell him how nice—how much nicer than her present spouse—her first husband was. And John didn't like it—wouldn't stand it in fact. So to-day he took down the picture of the lamented first husband and with many a chuckle of sweet revenge danced upon it. But in the midst of his glee came a shriek of grief and pain. He had forgotten to put on his shoes, and the glass over the picture was cutting his feet terribly. Two hours later came lockjaw.

**CONCERNING WHEAT.**—The great metropolitan dailies are preparing learned editorials on "wheat" showing the great factor of this American cereal in the business speculations of the world. According to the estimate of the government 567,910,000 bushels is the total of the incoming crop. "The heavy increase in foreign use of American corn in late years must lead to some extent the demand for wheat, which until recently has not reached 200,000,000 bushels except in years of pretty general injury to crops abroad. The course of exports and of the markets within the next few weeks will probably give clearer indication as to the quantity of wheat carried over, and also as to coming crops abroad, but facts at present in sight can hardly be held a safe basis for an important statement in prices. The government reports showing exports in May at an average of 67 cents a bushel, against an average of \$1.35 in May last year, is a forcible reminder of the damage that underlies guesses near the end of a crop year about quantities carried over on the farms."

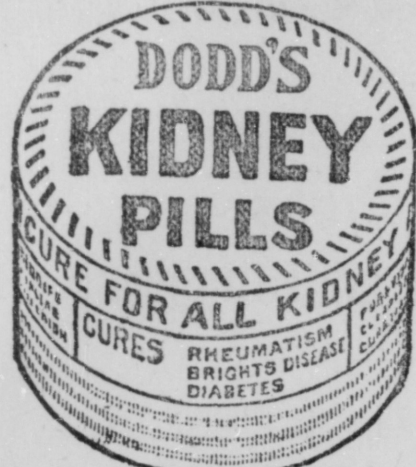
