A gentleman, the representative of a Montreal manufacturing firm says the Times, while in Nova Scotia recently, was the witness of circumstances which tend to confirm the opinion already entertained by some that Benjamin Trefry, who mysteriously disappeared from East River, near Yarmouth, about three months ago, was not murdered, as many suppose but is still in the flesh, alive and well.

Delegates from the various Young Men's Catholic Societies, to the number of 163, appeared at the Vatican on the 6th inst., and paid their homage to the Pope. His holiness addressed them at much length, and among other things said their was to much reason to fear that a social catastrophe was imminent. Catholics, especially the young should do all in their power to prevent its occurrence.

The smallest steam engine in the world is now claimed by the Toronto Globe to be the production of a resident of Arkona, Can. The Globe says: "The dimensions of this miniature affair are as follows: Diameter of cylinder, 1/2 of 1-16 of an inch; stroke, 1-32 of an inch; weight, 1/2 of a grain, bore of cylinder 3125 of a square inch; revolution, 1750 per minute; horse power, 12496 part of a horse power. This engine is so small that it can easily be covered with the case of a 22-calibre cartridge.

It is a somewhat remarkable fact, says the London World, that the cheapest way to send a certain class of goods from Liverpool to London is via New York. This arises from the keen competition between outward-bound Atlantic steamers for profitable dead weight. The other day 1,000 tons of rough freight was offered for carriage to London, no time being specified. The London lines tendered at 1s. a ton, but one of the Atlantic firms undertook to deliver it for 6s. a ton, and the offer was accepted.
