I have never forgotten the surprise I experienced as a young fellow one Tuesday afternoon some 34 years ago in seeing the first automobile race past our farm home. (The advent of the automobile to the Garden of the Gulf is within the memory of all middle-aged Islanders) yet consider how far we have gone in the matter of transportation in the short space of time since autos began running on our roads.

To most farmers the auto and truck have been a blessing in that they provide rapid transportation between farm and market. Before the advent of the motor car, when a machine went haywire or when there was a hurried call for an errand which demanded immediate carrying out, it often took hours when the busy farmer could least be spared to go to the village, town or city. Now with the automobile, the same errands can be executed in fast order.

Farm folk have been criticized for putting too much money into too many cars. This may be true up to a certain point. When farmers run into debt, or purchase trucks and cars at the expense of other necessary equipment, they have not shown the best judgment. Yet no mere dollars can measure the value of the automobile to the Island farmers.

It has taken Mr. Farmer and his family to the sea shore, taken them to the city for recreation, taken them on joyous holiday trips across the island, to the mainland, and to foreign strands,

removed the curse of isolation and loneliness for those who happened to be living in backward districts. These changing times are something to ponder. But let us turn once again to pioneer days in this province, or to go back a little further on the highway of time to the day they left Europe. They knew full well that they were seeing their homelands for the last time. Never again would the family circle be complete.

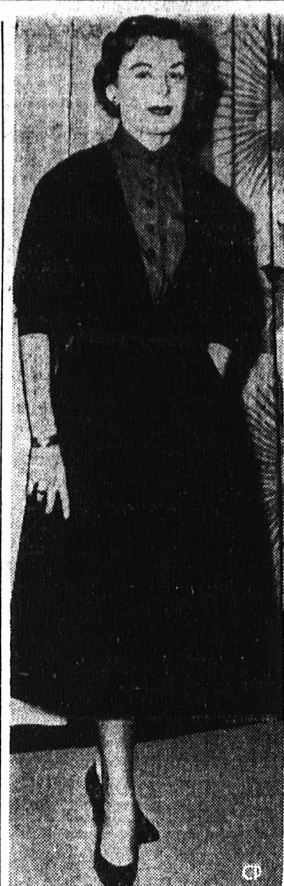
For many it was farewell forever. Why? Because of transportation difficulties, lack of money to take an ocean voyage, and last but not least the uncertainty of the mails. Unless your letter was carried to its destination by some trusted person, the chances were heavily against its ever being received.

It is difficult for this generation to realize or appreciate the benefits that have come with these changing times. It took weeks to sail around the Island in early times. Airplanes can do it in a matter of minutes, and the automobile can cover the same distance in a single day. Crossing the Northumberland Strait was a hazardous journey in winter by ice boat. The same voyage is now done in less than one hour on one of the world's most up-to-date ice breaking ferries.

One hundred years ago the end of the settlement was just about the end of the world for many Island folk. What lay beyond the primeval forests was unknown, strange, almost to be avoided. Farm youth of today have no such feelings. They know what lies beyond. Boundary lines have disappeared and with their going went ignorance and prejudice, as well as those sectional differences that came from lack of knowledge or understanding of the other fellow's problems and view-points.

One of the big events in the life of a pioneer boy or girl was that of visiting a relative who lived say 20 miles away. The journey was usually begun in the early morning of a fine summer day. "Nellie," the old farm plug, was as tired as the children were, at the end of the trip. Today the same distance can be covered by the family auto in less than half an hour.

Today the farm woman can enjoy an evening's ride away from the drudgery of pots and pans and meals, which is as it should be, for there has been little pleasure in past years in the lives of most farm women.

A Product of Noxzema

Says Gov't Plundering The Taxpayers

OTTAWA, Nov. 6 (CP)—E. D. Fulton, Progressive Conservative member of the Commons for the British Columbia constituency of Kamloops, said Tuesday the Federal Government is "plundering the taxpayers' pockets."

The government, he said, has been overtaxing the Canadian people at the rate of \$1,000,000 a day.

Mr. Fulton's speech was prepared for broadcast over the trans-Canada network in the CBC's series "The Nation's Business." He spoke from Vancouver and the text of his speech was released through his office here.

Finance Minister Abbott and other members of the cabinet have changed their tune, said Mr. Fulton. A few months ago they were saying there could be no tax cuts because of high defence costs. Now the Ministers were saying tax cuts were possible.

Mr. Fulton added: "With any luck, the government is hoping that Canadians will forget—in the joy of getting back a portion of their own hard-earned money—that over a five-year-period, personal income tax rates could have been slashed 54 per cent and the budget still balanced, will forget those excessive hidden taxes that have made the cost of living a nightmare."
