De Gaulle
Cheered
in Mexico

MEXICO CITY (AP)—Speaking in Spanish from the balcony of the National Palace here, President de Gaulle touched off a tumultuous ovation here with a proposal that France and Mexico join hands in trying to solve the changing world.

The bare-headed de Gaulle, launching in Mexico his drive to advance French prestige in Latin America, was accorded the honor of being the first foreign chief of state ever to speak from the presidential balcony overlooking Mexico City's Constitution Plaza.

Thousands cheered him as he drove under clouds of confetti from the airport into the city and a crowd estimated at 200,000 gathered outside the palace to hear him speak.

President Adolfo Lopez Mateos introduced the towering de Gaulle as "the hero of the freedom and grandeur of the French people."

The Gaulle declared that the "world is in transformation and nothing is more important than cooperation among countries like ours."

GOLFERS TEST BEER THEORY

MIAMI (AP)—About 20 golfers at the Country Club swigged beer before playing to test a theory that a beer before golf can improve putting skill.

The club said 45 per cent of the men and women in the test improved their putting scores by at least 10 per cent after a drink of beer. Forty per cent showed no change and 15 per cent did worse.

The experiment was conducted by club president Howard Kaskel, a ranking New York amateur golfer, and Frank Straface of Miami, club tournament director and lead-in amateur.

Some players refused to take part in the tests on grounds they couldn't stand a brew so early in the day. Others said they first tried with using a stimulant to improve their score.

"They don't permit horses to be doped before a race," said one.

During the test the participating golfers each downed a beer and teed up dry on alternate days.

Burton Calls Canadians Best

TORONTO (CP)—Richard Burton, married quietly to Elizabeth Taylor in Montreal Sunday, has described their marriage as "the best kept secret in the world."

Smiling broadly as he and his new wife stepped off a chartered Trans-Canada Air Lines Viscount, the Welsh actor said: "Canadians are the best people in the world. Thirty-five people knew about our plan, but not one of them said a word about it."

That, he said, was "an extreme example of fundamental honesty."

The famous couple spoke only a few words to reporters and photographers as they rushed from the plane to a private limousine.

Miss Taylor only said "thanks" when reporters congratulated her on her fifth marriage.

They arrived here shortly before 4 p.m. and then headed for their suite at the downtown King Edward Sheraton Hotel.

Burton and Miss Taylor came in Toronto for the pre-Broadway run of the modern-dress version of Hamlet in which Burton plays the title role. He was to appear again Monday night.

CNR Hotel Here Operated At Loss Past Two Years

CAPITAL BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN (OTTAWA)—The Charlottetown Hotel has operated at a loss for the past two years, a return tabulated in the Commons has revealed.

Transport Minister J. W. Pickens listed the profit or loss for each of the 10 hotels operated by the Canadian National Railway.

For 1962, the last year for which figures are available the Charlottetown Hotel had a loss of \$27,351 and in 1961 the loss was \$30,650. In 1960 the hotel realized a \$6,201 profit and in 1959 it made a modest \$4,668. Of the 10 hotels, four reported losses in 1962.

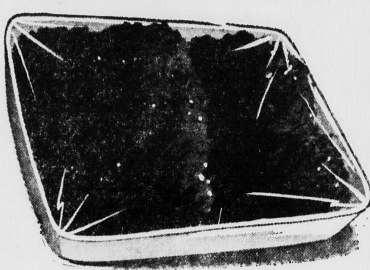

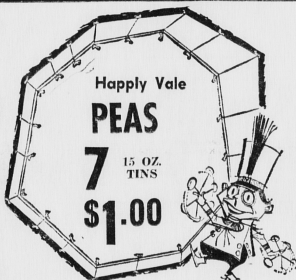

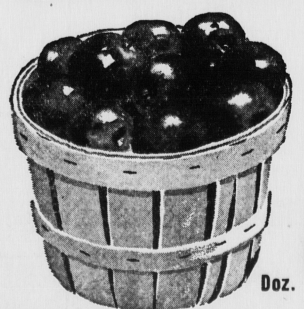
