PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.—The Halifax Presbyterian College Convocation has been held at Halifax. Among the graduates is D. J. McDonald, an Islander. The Home Mission Board of the Church in Canada, eastern section, was also held at Halifax yesterday. D. J. Nicholson will labor on the Island—and C. C. McIntosh, an Islander, will go to the Sydney district.

ARRESTED FOR THEFT.—A young man named Henry Weeks was this morning arrested on a charge of stealing tobacco and cigars from the store of John Cameron on the Malpeque Road. The theft was committed on the evening of the 2nd March last, and Weeks, in order to avoid arrest went to Sydney. Upon his return he was gathered in by the police.

MAJOR DAVISON'S FUNERAL.—The funeral of the late Major Geo. D. Davison takes place to-morrow afternoon. The military, consisting of Nos. 1 and 2 Cos. Artillery, Nos. 1 and 3 Cos. 82nd Batt., and a detachment of the Engineers will attend. The Masons and Foresters will also form part of the procession.

COURT OF CHANCERY.

Nicholson vs. Cameron.

The Master of the Rolls, this morning, delivered judgment in this case. The action was brought to set aside a mortgage given by the plaintiff to the defendant for the sum of \$800. The plaintiff charged that he executed the mortgage through fraud practised on him by James H. Good, formerly of this city, and who was a practising lawyer here. He claimed that he only intended to sign a mortgage for \$150, and thought that he had signed one for that amount. He contended that Good was the agent of the defendant and that the defendant was responsible for his acts. Good, shortly after the execution of the mortgage, absconded from this Province taking with him some of the mortgage money. The defendant denied that Good was his agent, and proved that he had given Good the \$800, and that Good was acting as plaintiff's agent when the loan was negotiated and claimed that he was not responsible for any fraud practised by Good. The Master of the Rolls found against the plaintiff's contentions and in favor of the defendant and dismissed the Bill of Complaint with costs.

As already announced, Mr. Pope has kindly consented to repeat his lecture upon Lost Atlantis before the Natural History and Antiquarian Society in the Kindergarten Hall next Monday evening; when it is hoped that all those who were unable to attend the last meeting will take advantage of this opportunity of hearing the lecture which was so much enjoyed by all who heard it last Tuesday. 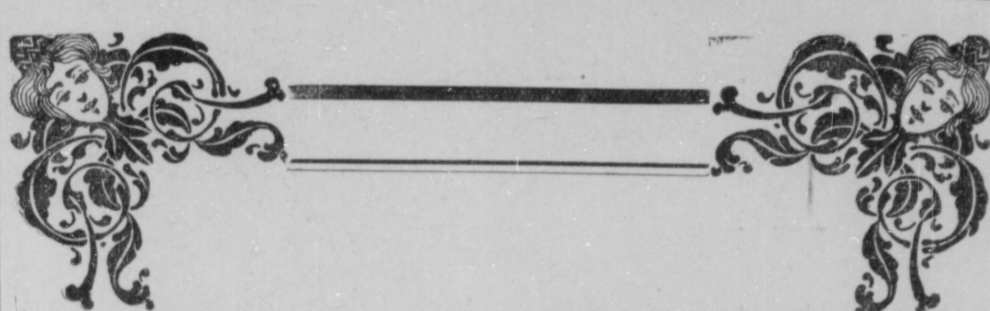

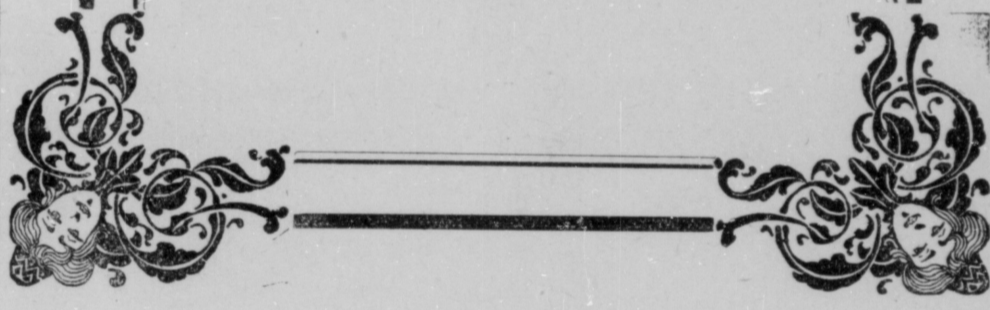
