

Construction Of Alberton School Nears Completion

Construction of a four-room school on Dufferin Street at Alberton is rapidly nearing completion and first classes will be held in the new building today. Grades five and six will move from the curling rink where they have been located since school reopened in the fall. Grade eleven will transfer from the library to the new school on Tuesday.

Building operations on the 45 x 75 structure were started late in October and have progressed exceptionally fast despite much unfavorable weather. Specifications and blueprints were provided by the Department of Education. All four class rooms are large and well lighted. Provision is to be made at a later date for a teachers' rest room. Heating is by forced hot air.

NEW YORK (CP)—The lifeboat crew of the Queen of Bermuda and the liner's captain will receive awards from the city today for their rescue last week of all 10 men from the Newfoundland fishing vessel Student Prince II.

The crew of eight volunteers under staff Capt. Magnus Musson manoeuvred in storm-tossed seas last Wednesday to take aboard the 10 men from the fishing vessel which sank in the Atlantic north of Bermuda.

The nine men and the Queen's captain, Leslie Banyard, who ordered his ship to turn about and steam 150 miles to the rescue, will receive the city's department of marine aviation distinguished service awards.

Mayor Robert Wagner asked that the awards be made. The presentation will be made by department commissioner A. G. O'Connor.
