Nfld. Liberal Protests Post Office Dept.

OTTAWA (CP) — A Newfoundland Liberal protested Saturday that the post office department is interfering with the rights and liberties of residents of his province's remote outposts.

Chesley W. Carter, Burin, said in the Commons a department order issued preventing these people from posting letters in large quantities to obtain faster postal service.

Mail service in most Newfoundland communities is once a week or once every two weeks. Many people found it necessary to take important communications to a larger neighboring community which had daily mail service.

The department's refusal to permit them to do this "is a tremendous interference with the rights and liberties of these people," Mr. Carter said.

OFFICIALS TOO FEAR Charles R. Franger (L-Grand Falls-White Bay-Labrador) complained of the lack of postal services along the coastal communities along the coast. He said that the post office was running mail from the mainland steamers had to follow to a port of call where there was a postmaster.

He also proposed restriction of postmasters traveling in Newfoundland to facilitate inter-provincial mailings.
