

**WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS
PAVED ROADS**

In order to properly protect the paved roads of Prince Edward Island, and at the same time impose the minimum weight restriction, the following shall apply effective midnight Tuesday, 17th March, 1959:—

1. Vehicles registered for 16,000 lbs., or less, are permitted gross weight of 8,000 lbs.
2. Vehicles registered for over 16,000 lbs. are limited to one-half registered weight.
