Quebecers Plan Virtual Independence

MONTREAL (CP)—Some influential members of the Quebec branch of the New Democratic Party are proposing an amendment to the constitution that would give the "state of Quebec" virtual independence.
The proposal is contained in a working paper prepared for the provincial NDP's policy convention here June 29. A founding and leadership convention is to be held later.

The paper released Wednesday was prepared by Andre "Hector" Gagnon, national secretary of the NDP and the province's key organizer in Quebec.
Michael Chartrand, former provincial NDP leader, and Jacques-Yvan Morin, professor of international law at the University of Montreal.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

TEST BY B. JAY BECKER

1. You are declarer with the West and at Four. Heart is North having overcalled your heart bid with a spade. North leads a trump. You draw three rounds of trumps, South discarding a club and a diamond, and then clubs and at least five spades, the contract is now sure to make, but how would you play the hand?

2. You are declarer with the West hand at Three Notrump. North leads the two of hearts and you win the king with the hand. How would you play the hand?

1. North is known to have started with exactly three hearts and at least three clubs and five spades, and hence cannot have more than two diamonds. The contract can therefore be sustained by cashing the K-A of diamonds and leading a spade from dummy.
Let's assume South follows with the eight, nine, ten, jack or queen, in any order, and you play the king. North wins with the ace and cannot defeat you as regards what he discards. He cashes two more spades, he is still on lead and regarding what he discards. As a result, the diamond loser disappears.

WOULD KILL SEPARATISM

It calls for firm rejection of the principle of federal subsidies and a clearer definition of federal and provincial taxation powers so that both levels of government can collect the revenues needed to their responsibilities.
Both papers call for changes in the powers of the Supreme Court of Canada, whose jurisdiction on constitutional questions would be transferred to a new court.

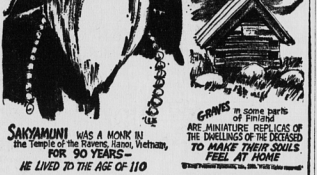
