

### CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been: West North East South 1♣ 1♦ Pass ? What do you now bid with each of the following four hands?

- 1. ♠J742 ♣KQ85 ♣K93 4-6 2. ♠Q6 ♠A9 ♠AQ73 ♠Q1085 3. ♠K104 ♠Q73 ♠AJ752 4. ♠QJ83 ♠KQ94 ♠KJ2 4-7

Opening lead—king of hearts. It is a good idea for declarer to view with suspicion any act by a defender which appears to be giving him a trick, or a chance to gain a trick. It cannot logically be assumed that any play by either defender is designed to help the declarer.

A failure to appreciate this principle of play brought about South's defeat in today's hand. West held the opening lead and at trick two shifted to the four of spades. Declarer played low from dummy and lost to the king. A spade was returned. Ultimately, South had to lose a club trick to go down one.

When his play is examined, it is found South lost the hand by failing to go up with the ace when West led the four of spades. With so many alternate safe leads for West to make, there cannot be a sound basis for the hope he has led away from the king.

### Being Sent To Work In Russia

VIENNA AP—Communist Bulgaria's controlled press confirmed Tuesday that Bulgarian youth and other unemployed are being sent to Russia to work. Diplomatic reports recently have said thousands of Bulgarians have been deported to work in Siberia on farms or in the mines and factories of Czechoslovakia. The latest edition of the Bulgarian Communist youth newspaper, Narodna Mladost, received here says:

"It is now permitted for Bulgarian youth, girls and men to enroll for three-year terms of work in the Soviet Union in mines, on building sites and on collective farms. Applicants aged 18 to 20 are accepted. Those who come are granted the honorary title of brigade workers. Only the healthy are accepted."

Diplomatic reports received here have maintained that these "volunteers."

### Nobody Is Ever Sent Back By West Berlin Screening

Canadian Press Staff Writer BERLIN (CP)—Call him Hermann Schmidt. He sits facing three examiners in a bare little room, feet wide apart, his pale, weakly handsome face impassive. Only a nervous flick of his tongue betrays disquiet.

Schmidt was born in 1933, the year Hitler came to power. He is one of 4,840 East Germans who sought political asylum in West Germany in the first week of May. His sad, complicated story—mother killed in an air raid on Weimar, gestapo official father shot by the Russians, his brother missing—holds little novelty for the three interrogators in the Marienfelde refugee camp in South Berlin.

They have heard him many times before. Parts of his narrative seem suspect, but the officials finally give him clearance. Nobody is ever sent back across the Iron Curtain, anyway. Soon he will be flown out of Berlin—it has to be by air—to start a new life in Hannover or Duesseldorf or Cologne, free for the first time since the age of seven from war or Russian occupation. But he says:

"I want to join the army. I think I need a little discipline."

Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP)—The Manchester Guardian, concerned at the possibility of a prolonged deadlock resulting from Canada's general election, suggests that Prime Minister St. Laurent and Progressive Conservative Leader John Diefenbaker come to London for the Commonwealth prime ministers' conference.

"It would be deplorable if the man who will be head of the Canadian government should not attend the Commonwealth conference," The Guardian says after noting that both Liberals and Conservatives lack a parliamentary majority and may have difficulty forming a government. The Times sees little likelihood that the prime minister will attend the conference later this month. "He is a proud man who may not relish meeting his colleagues from the Commonwealth in London as prime minister on sufferance," The Times comments, predicting St. Laurent's early resignation. The unexpectedness of the Progressive Conservative victory is unanimously reflected in British editorial comment. Several papers draw a parallel with President Truman's upset of Thomas E. Dewey in the 1948 United States presidential election. WELCOME DIEFENBAKER "One of the refreshing aspects of democracy is that the impossible happens." ### Presbyterians Increase Budget

VANCOUVER (CP)—A budget of \$1,680,000 for 1958 has been adopted by the Presbyterian General Assembly over the protest of some church officials who had proposed a budget of \$1,500,000.

A vote Tuesday night approved the higher sum. The assembly has deferred debate on salary increases for ministers, awaiting budget passage and a report from a special committee on stipends. The board of administration has proposed that the minimum stipend be increased \$200 a year to \$3,000. Edmonton presbytery has recommended an increase to \$3,900 "to keep pace with the cost of living."

The general assembly accepted an invitation from Toronto's Glenview Church to meet there in June. Professor David W. Hay of Knox College, Toronto, called for extension of grounds for divorce. He said the church regards desertion as sufficient grounds, "but the law insists upon adultery."
