### Deep Purple — The House Of Blue Light

Finally the group which rocked the U.S. and Canada throughout the 1970's has returned with this long awaited album. The first release off this LP, "Bad Attitude" is already receiving rave reviews. People have considered Deep Purple's reunion as a cash-in on sentimentalism but such is not the case with this powerful album. The first release "Bad Attitude" is a very good tune and entered Q-104's single's chart at number 20 in its first week after being first released.

Another good song on the album is "The House" which can be expanded upon in future albums. Other songs on the album include hot tunes like

"Hard-Lovin' Woman", "Unwritten Law", "Call Of The Wild", "Mitzi Dupree", and "Spanish Archer".

to be sure they can finance their education." "CFS policy is that the best form of student aid is a summer job," states Macerollo. "It's because there aren't great employment prospects that we have to rely on government aid so heavily," he says. However, lobbying is only one aspect of the Canadian Federation of Students. As a member of CFS, The UPEI Student Union gets research papers and resource people that provide support for the Union when they try to develop a project, service, or launch a political campaign. One benefit this support brought UPEI students was the visit by Premier Ghiz in October.

In regards to the decreasing quality of education, Macerollo concluded with the statement "It's not unreasonable for students to feel a bit upset... they should view (improvements like) the upgrading of your athletic facilities not as a happy perk, but as something

that must happen." He says, "You have to view the additional expenditure on periodicals in your library again not as a happy surprise, but as something that is crucial, especially if you're going to be able to have a respectable education."

Macerollo and CFS would like to see UPEI students become more involved, and be aware that they can change the educational system as it stands. Macerollo feels that the lack of student action across the country is not due to apathy, but because "if people don't perceive an ability on their part to change the situation, because they can't find the means to change it, or it looks too complicated, or they don't feel they can do it all by themselves, then they live with the trouble." The responsibility of CFS, he says, is to identify the channels, where students can make their concerns known, and that is what CFS student awareness week is all about.

with cutbacks in funding, NSERC will attempt to concentrate funds to a few major centres in an attempt to maintain excellence. This is a concern because theoretical research such as Nilsson's is only funded by the government. He says

private industry is "simply not interested" in research not leading to marketable results.

There is concern that major cutbacks by NSERC may not be able to maintain research efforts at small universities, like UPEI, across Canada.

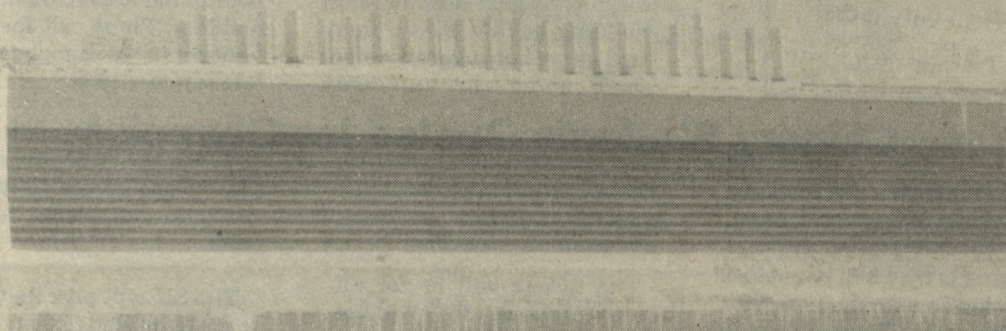
of a 12-16 week training period, participants will have a fully developed business plan. New businesses developed with the support of the Youth Enterprise Centres will have access to all necessary expertise during
