**Saints Please Summerside**

**Clay, Terrell Announcement**

Clay last defended his title Nov. 14 with a third round technical knockout of Cleveland Williams of Houston.

Terrell, recognized as the World Boxing Association champion of the heavyweights, defended his title last June in Houston with a 15-round decision over Doug Jones.

**Torres, Tiger Sign Contracts**

NEW YORK (AP)—Champion Jose Torres and challenger Dick Tiger formally signed contracts Monday for their light heavyweight title fight at Madison Square Garden Dec. 16.

It will be the fourth title defense this year for the 30-year-old Torres, a Puerto Rico-born New Yorker. It is the first appearance for Tiger, 37, a Nicaraguan, since he lost his mid-

weight crown to Emile Griffith April 25.

Torres is guaranteed \$70,000 and 40 per cent of the gate, whichever is larger. Tiger, with no guarantee, will receive 20 per cent of the proceeds.

**Brazil Rallies; Threaten India**

CALCUTTA, India (AP)—Brazil's Jose Edson Mandrino and Thomas Koch, one match from defeat, rallied spectacularly Monday and moved within a set of victory over surprising India in the Davis Cup interzone tennis final.

Competition was halted by darkness with the left-handed Koch leading Ramanathan Krishnan, Indian's veteran No. 1 ace, 6-3, 4-6, 12-10 in the fifth and deciding match at Calcutta's South Club.

Mandrino, the 20-year-old youngster who struck the killing blow against the United States last month at Porto Alegre, Brazil, won a 3 1/2 hour battle from Jaideep Mukherjee, 9-7, 3-6, 6-4, 3-6, 7-5, to knot the best-of-five series at two matches each.

The final day's competition, determining the team to challenge Australia for the trophy at Melbourne Dec. 26-28, drew a sell-out crowd of 6,000.

**Hockey School Over Holidays**

A six-day school for boys age seven to 15, will be held at St. Dunstan's University during the Christmas vacation period, it was announced yesterday by Ed Hilton and Jack Kane, athletic director and hockey coach, respectively, at S.D.U.

The school, the first of its kind ever staged in this area, will stress fundamentals, with emphasis on skating.
