Hospital Ass'n Meetings Conclude

SAINT JOHN, N. B. (CP)—A revision of the moral code for hospitals is being undertaken by a commission of theologians, the 30th annual conference of the Maritime Catholic Hospital Association was told Thursday.

Rev. Henri Legarl, Ottawa, executive director of the Canadian Catholic Hospital Association, said the commission will present its final report to the episcopal committee on hospitals.

Father Legarl described an "institute on moral problems" held in the archdiocese of Regina this year. Those at the sessions included 25 physicians, 30 lay nurses and 30 chaplains.

The Maritime association, ending its annual meeting, decided to conduct a similar institute at a date to be set.

The executive will continue in office for a second term. Rev. Sister St. Hugh of Charlottetown is president.
