Although the steel superstructure has been removed, the pile understructure makes the bridge perfectly safe for all and any normal traffic. It was unknown last evening whether trucks would be permitted to travel over the bridge, or would still be required to detour.

Leader Of Berber Tribesmen Lashes Out At France

RABAT, Morocco (AP)—The pasha of Marrakech, leader of Berber tribesmen challenging the rule of pro-nationalist Sultan Sidi Mohammed Ben Youssef, lashed out against France in a statement Tuesday.

Pasha Thami El Glaoui, said to have armed tribesmen poised ready to strike, declared that unless France deposes the sultan immediately "her friends can tomorrow become the enemies of France."

El Glaoui has been France's best friend in Morocco for 40 years, but in his statement issued in Marrakech he said: "I wish to believe that they understand in France the limits of my friendship."

Tension mounted throughout this French protectorate as the two rival leaders sparred for support of Berbers and Moors in a situation fraught with explosive possibilities.

Declaration Day Results

Mr. Angus A. MacLean and Mr. Neil A. Matheson were officially declared elected yesterday on Declaration Day when Returning Officer for Queens County, Mr. Gilbert A. Gaudet, completed the count of the ballots.

Mr. MacLean was one of the Progressive Conservative candidates, while Mr. Matheson represented the Liberal Party. There was little change in the total vote as given the day following the election with the main difference arising from the Canadian Forces and Veteran Voting, the results of which were not known here the night of the election.
