Filbert, driven by Joe Hennessey of Charlottetown, went the fastest mile of the afternoon as he took the second heat of the No. 1 classified in 2:12. Filbert won the class honors taking the second and third heats after Silk Hal with Roach MacGregor in the sulkie won the first in 2:12 1-5.

Harold Stead had Calumet Onward in good form to win the No. 2 classified by taking the first two heats of the class. The Stead driven horse came from third place to take the first heat but lead all the way in the second. Miss Commando, who finished second in the first two heats won the third in 2:17.

## N. Y. Yankees In 2-1 Victory Over White Sox

 Ed Lopat performed the operation and Hank Bauer sewed it up Wednesday as New York Yankees crept within 2½ games of the league-leading Chicago White Sox.

With Lopat hurling his 10th triumph of the American League campaign, the Yankees defeated the Pale Hose 2-1 before a crowd of 29,940 at Yankee Stadium.

In the other daylight American League game, Cleveland Indians outlasted Boston Red Sox 14-8 in a slugfest in Boston. The National League's only day encounter saw Boston Braves whip Chicago Cubs 9-0 at Chicago behind Warren Spahn, in their first start under new manager Tommy Holmes.

The White Sox wasted numerous opportunities to hang the crusher on Lopat. They tapped him for 10 hits, but it was only in the fourth that Paul Richards' gang managed to bunch three hits for their one run. Even then they needed a Yankee error to score. Richards scored one run and knocked in the other one. With

the bombers trailing 1-0 in the seventh, he opened with a single, went to second on an infield out and tallied on Yogi Berra's single. In the eighth, with young Billy Pierce weakening, Lopat and Mickey Mantle drew walks. Phil Rizzuto forced Lopat at third, and Bauer loped a single to score Mantle.

Spahn gave the Cubs little chance as he notched his eighth victory of the year. The National League's leading strikeout artist whiffed eight to bring his total to 65, gave up but five hits and permitted just one Cub to reach third base.

All this was sweet music, indeed, to Holmes, appointed Wednesday as Braves manager to succeed Billy Southworth.

The Indians' victory was a personal triumph for little Bobby Avila, who hit three homers, a double and a single for 15 bases, just two off the record held jointly by Ty Cobb and Lou Gehrig.

Six Boston pitchers were the victims of the Indian attack. The defeat was charged to Bill Wright, who hurled only one-third of an inning and was blasted for five hits.

A three-run first-inning rally held up for Detroit Tigers as they defeated Philadelphia 7-2 in the opening game of a two-night doubleheader.
