# Bail Is \$4,000 Each For Robbery Accused

Bail was set at \$4,000 each on Lester Yessy and Laurie William MacDonald yesterday when they appeared before Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, in Queens County Magistrate's Court on charges of robbery with violence.

The charges arose out of the beating and robbery Nov. 20 of Mrs. John Spencer, Sr., West Royal.

Counsel for the accused, Lester O'Donnell, made an application for bail, which was set at \$4,000 each with two sureties of \$2,000.

Crown Prosecutor Alan K. Seales asked for an adjournment as Mrs. Spencer is still in the intensive care section of the P.E.I. Hospital and unable to appear in court as a witness.

## Potato Prices Now Double Last Year's

Charlottetown potato dealers are reported to be paying about 75c per 75-pound bag, more than double the price of a year ago when growers were getting about 40 cents per bag.

A Charlottetown dealer said potato prices were firm all across the country and should remain at a high level for the next two months.

Prices during the crop year rose from 75 cents in August to \$1.50 in October. They eased slightly to \$1.15, then rose again to the present price.
