

# Carnival Air Is Felt Already In Summerside

The committee which has laid the plans for the third annual Summerside Lobster Carnival meeting their final pre-carnival meeting last evening in the Civic Stadium, focal point of the carnival activities and location of the delicious lobster suppers served daily during the four day carnival.

Already the stadium is beginning to assume a carnival atmosphere as booths are completed, in preparation for the program which commences next Wednesday afternoon with a big parade, which will include three military bands, proceeding from Summerside East through the main streets of the town along a route ending at the stadium where the serving of lobster suppers will get the carnival underway. The official opening will be made that evening by Lieutenant Governor Walter Hyndman.

Among those who will witness the big parade, and enjoy the lobster supper on Wednesday will be the children of the two orphanages at Charlottetown, guests of the Canadian Legion who provide an annual outing for the orphans.

Final details of the program were completed last night by the committee composed of representatives of all Summerside service clubs, the Legion, and Board of Trade, whose members all play important roles in the smooth operation of the event.

The opening parade will include two "ducks" named "Daisy" and "Donald" — amphibious vehicles with a capacity of 25 adults or 33 children, which will operate every day carrying passengers from the carnival grounds on a sight-seeing tour of Summerside harbour along the shoreline and back to the grounds.

Last year's Sea Queen, June Ford, will be included on the parade floats which will carry the sea queen contestants this year, and "Queen June" will reign throughout the carnival and until the crowning of the new queen on Saturday afternoon in a program which will be carried on the CBC trans-Canada radio network direct from Summerside.

All of the booth area within the stadium has already been taken up, and at least a dozen industrial booths will be included among the others.

## Seven Fishermen Are Fined For Having Short Lobsters

Seven Tignish fishermen were assessed fines for possession of undersized lobsters by Magistrate R. S. Hinton at Alberton yesterday.

The lowest amount was a nominal fine of \$5.00 and costs for possession of seven short lobsters, the highest a \$50.00 fine for possession of 140 pounds of shorts.

A Tignish resident was fined \$5.00 and costs for obstructing a fisheries officer and also ordered to pay damages of \$15.00 on fixation of a ¾ ton truck seized at Cascumpec on the 10th of May was confirmed by the magistrate. The owner was a lobster factory operator from Campbellton. When seized the vehicle contained ten bags of short lobsters.

A man from St. Louis pleaded guilty to possession of liquor not purchased from a vendor (a ten gallon keg containing approximately seven gallons of home made beer) and was fined \$25.00 and costs.
