

Astronomical Discovery:

Wonderful as have been the revelations made through the spectroscopic in regard to the constitution and nature of celestial bodies, the results of its use for the purposes to which the telescope might seem specially fitted are no less surprising. The star Algol is well known for its remarkable variations in intensity of light. It shines as a star of the second magnitude for two and a half days, and then in the course of a few hours loses five-sixths of its brilliancy. It remains thus dimmed for about fifteen minutes, and then in a few hours rapidly becomes restored to its usual lustre. The regularity of this phenomenon suggested, a hundred years ago, the existence of a large opaque body revolving around it. The spectroscopic, in the hands of Prof. Vogel, has now demonstrated the truth of the old conjecture. Around Algol, which is 134 times as large as the earth, revolves a dark planet, one hundred times the size of our globe. The existence of a sun and a planet so nearly alike in proportions is not at all what analogies drawn from the solar systems would lead anyone to suspect. It would not be surprising if some distant planet should be found big enough to compel its sun to revolve around it, instead of, as in the case of the great satellite of Algol, swinging its bright companion around an inner circle.

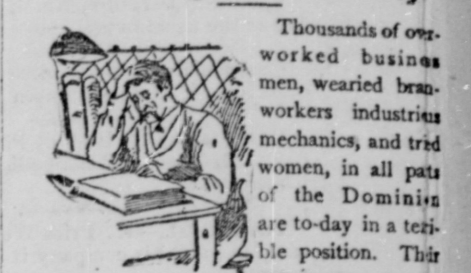
