RCMP Serving In Quebec Are Bilingual

MONTREAL (CP)—All commissioned officers and about 95 per cent of all other personnel serving with the RCMP in Quebec province now are bilingual, Chief Superintendent Armand Thivierge said here.

He said in an interview that with the expansion of the force in Quebec in recent years, the emphasis on bilingualism in the RCMP throughout the province has been increased. "It hasn't been a sudden upsurge of bilingualism," said Supt. Thivierge, who commands the Quebec division. "Rather all this has been a matter of gradual transition."

Signs on the doors of offices at the division's headquarters in Montreal now are printed in both French and English, as are the inscriptions on business envelopes used by the force. HEIPS IN INTERVIEWS

The ideal, said the superintendent, is that any French-speaking persons interviewed by RCMP members should be interviewed in their own language.

"We must also allow French-speaking members of the force to write their reports in French if they so choose," he added. Supt. Thivierge, whose own native language is French, said the force in Quebec by no means excludes English-speaking men from its ranks.

He said expansion of the force in Quebec "opens up new opportunities for deserving bilingual men here."

He said that including civilian help, the RCMP establishment in the province numbers about 700 persons.
