OPEN LETTER NO. 2.

To the Hon. Donald Farquharson:
SIR,—There was a time in the history of this country when you were named by The Patriot as "unsound" on the school question in 1876 and by that stripe of politicians sound on all questions. The temperance advocates doubtless considered you "unsound" on the "liquor question." But you have shattered their hopes. You have now earned to yourself a just, right, title and claim to the sobriquet of "Donald Unsound;" and I thereby dub you as the little Premier of small intellect, "Donald the Unsound." In your own history you have done your little best to stigmatize another gentleman, the latches of whose shoes you are not worthy to unloose, with the same terms; but as you have not by any means proved his right to the title I am of the opinion that your claim at present is beyond cavil or dispute and "Donald the Unsound" shall hereafter be synonymous with your name. Lord Macceckiac was a great man, but not half so tyrannous and spiteful as the little cross-road Premier, "Donald the Unsound."

Hitherto you have not by debate or ability earned any right to be styled a statesman. A man of your principles never yet rose to the dignity of a statesman, for a statesman should first be a "gentleman" and devoid of "selfishness," the latter attribute which is closely allied to yourself. You are made up of the material for "despotic Government" for a representative House of Assembly should be in close touch with the people, and your actions will cause the smothered embers to accumulate heat in secret until they burst into a general flame. The people impatient at length of enduring the wrongs over which they have long brooded in silent indignation, seek redress by open rebellion as the only method by which they can hope to obtain it. You would be admirably adapted to ancient democratic states where the principal of representation was not adopted. The "dash-away policy," the legitimate offspring of Peter Sinclair, has been utilized by your Government, and the Government that preceded you as a Liberal Government. A million dollar debt; with your Hill-borough bridge and additional ferries, now stares us in the face!

Your budget speech is a rehash of shifting figures, like a dissolving view that promises much; but Grit promises are never to be fulfilled. We do not expect that you ever contemplate to make "revenue and expenditure" meet. These were empty, meaningless phrases of the "Grit party," and though they were sound in expression they are "unsound" in practice, and an additional factor in your claim to the title of "Premier Donald the Unsound." No wonder the college boys at their commencement exercises ridiculed you by saying, "What is the matter with Farquharson?"

Now, my "unsound" friend, you have been placed at the head of the Government in this Island and termed the leader. The victory has fallen on your side. The chief effort of your life should have been to strive and moderate, and if practicable to extinguish in your followers the virulent spirit of party. You should teach your friends by your own example that every degree of warmth should subside when the collision which produced it is an end. A wise premier or leader will use the most strenuous and unrelenting efforts to disarm the resentment of those who have exercised in support of the opposite interest a right which the constitution of Responsible Government has entrusted to their own discretion. Also my "unsound" friend a sound man will be aware that no local custom, no inalienable on his part, no persuasion on the part of others, will lead him to remunerate his voters—whether by entertainments, by distributing money, or in any other way which he conceives to be contrary to the spirit and actual intention of the laws. But we have no hope of such a course from an "unsound man" and we must look to the electors and yeomanry of Prince Edward Island as the saviors of the country. We must look to the men who are leaders on the other side to save the province from the grinding taxation which is inevitable if the reins shall much longer remain in your unsteady and "unsound" hands. Yes, an agitation must at once be made to dethrone you from your position—to relegate you to your private office—a position you are better adapted for than as leader for an imbecile government.

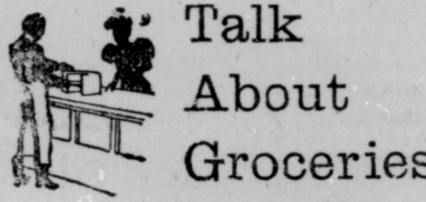
ESTEEMED EXCHANGES.

HOW TO GET TO CHARLOTTETOWN
The steamer Halifax leaves Boston for Charlottetown every Saturday at noon and will be at Charlottetown on Monday night. The following Tuesday at one she will be on return to Boston. Halifax and St. Hawkesbury are called at every 48 hours. Passengers may take the steamer by any of the ports mentioned. The Halifax will be supplemented by the Grand Duchess later in the season.

The steamer City of Ghent plys between Halifax and Charlottetown each week, calling at several ports en route. She is due here every Thursday.
The steamers Coban, Bonavists, Campana, Tiber and Polino, of Montreal, also make Charlottetown a port of call.
Passengers for this Province coming by way of Pictou are brought to Charlottetown by the steamer Princess. Those coming by way of Point Du Chene connect with the steamer Northumberland, and may come through to Charlottetown by the mail special which leaves Summerside each evening immediately after the steamer reaches that port.
