### IN MEMORIAM

Mr. John Fisher, of South Lake, P.E.I., passed away on March 30th, 1956, a victim of the very severe storm that passed over this area on that date. He had characteristically kind, reserved some visiting friends to their car on the main highway, a considerable distance from his residence, and apparently on the return trip to his home had become confused in the storm and darkness and lost his way. Alarmed at his failure to return home, friends and neighbors formed search parties and scoured the area. An alarm soon gave way to gloom and sorrow as it became evident that Mr. Fisher had wandered astray in the storm onto the ice on South Lake, and had fallen into the open channel which runs near his property. Dragging operations were unsuccessful, due to running ice, but a careful watch was kept on the shore and the remains were recovered about three weeks later. Mr. Fisher was 38 years of age, and a man of very kindly and friendly nature. Within the sphere in which he lived and moved there are few, indeed, who cannot recall a helping hand or generous gesture on his part. He was the son of the late Walter and Mrs. Fisher, of South Lake. Besides his uncle, Mr. Elwin Fisher, and his sisters: Alfred and Stanley, Genevieve, (Mrs. Alvin MacDonald), all of South Lake, Ellen, (Mrs. Joseph MacKinnon), Bear River, and Victoria, (Mrs. Leonard Ford) Boston, Mass.

His funeral to St. Columba Church, was, despite very poor road conditions, very largely attended. High Mass was celebrated by his Pastor, Rev. W. D. MacDonald, who also conducted the services at the grave. Pall bearers were: Stewart Cameron, D. A. Gillis, LeLaud MacDonald, Carl McVane, George Gillis and Wesley Bruce.

### Urges Limit On Imports Of U.S. Coal

OTTAWA (CP)—Limitation on imports of United States coal to help Canada's "failing" coal industry was suggested in the Commons Thursday by C. E. Johnston, representative of an Alberta coal-mining area. Mr. Johnston, Social Credit member for Bow River, said Canadian coal mines have been closing and miners put out of work with no immediate relief in sight. Canadian production totalled 14,770,000 tons in the 1954-55 fiscal year while imports of U.S. coal reached 18,183,000 tons. If U.S. imports could be reduced by 4,000,000 tons, the positions would be reversed and "I am sure our industry would be put back on its feet again."

He said he recognizes there have been heavy federal subsidies to assist movement of Western and Maritime coal to market. They totalled \$11,000,000 in 1954-55. But they could not be increased sufficiently to offset imports from the U.S. into the central markets of Ontario and Quebec.

It would be easy to put a ceiling on maximum imports without increasing the subsidy rate. Mr. Johnston said that during a four-year period to 1954-55 Canadian production fell 20.3 per cent. Yet Canada had practically seven per cent of the world's known coal supply. The coal industry was vital for defence, if for no other reason.
