Pirates Clobber Giants; Tigers Shutout Red Sox

Third baseman Frank Thomas hit two home runs, one a grand slammer, to lead Pittsburgh Pirates to a 14-6 triumph over San Francisco Giants Wednesday that belted the Giants out of first place in the National League. In other National League action Wednesday, Milwaukee Braves defeated Chicago Cubs 10-7.

In the American League, New York Yankees swept a double-bill from Kansas City 10-2 and 2-1. Detroit blanked Boston Red Sox 7-0 in the first game of a two-night double-bill. Besides the Tiger-Red Sox night game, two others were carded: Chicago at Washington and Cleveland at Baltimore.

At San Francisco, Thomas took over the home run leadership by hitting his 18th and 19th of the campaign. He also grabbed the RBI spot with 57. Vera Law got the win, Ruben Gomez the loss. Willie Mays continued in his slump, going to the plate three times and remaining hitless. At Chicago, the Braves lost an early 5-0 lead over the Cubs, but recovered to win and snap a five-game losing streak. High spot of the Braves' attack was Joe Adcock's first inning homer with the bases loaded. Four bases on balls in the ninth inning of the second New York game gave Bob Turley his 10th win of the season. Turley, who has lost only one

game, was locked in a pitching duel with Ralph Terry and Virgil Trucks, when Trucks suddenly lost his control after one was out in the bottom of the ninth. Trucks took over from Terry in the fifth. Turley thus became the first major leaguer to win 10

BOSTON (AP)—Detroit inched out of the American League cellar by whipping Boston 7-0 in the afternoon and 9-3 Wednesday night in the Tigers' first two games under their new manager Bill Norman.

The Red Sox had won six straight, their longest string of the season, before the Tigers blanked them in the afternoon. The white wash job was a strong five-hitter by Frank Lary who was strongly supported by a 13 hit onslaught.

Billy Martin, fiery Detroit shortstop had a time for himself. He drove in a total of seven runs in the two games. Martin put the Tigers ahead with his two-run homer in the second inning at night, and hit a three-run blast in the third.
