

# HIRINGS, MOVIE CLUB, HONORARIUMS, AFS, ...

On Sunday, Oct. 1st the second Student Council meeting of the year was held in the Board Room of Kelley. The meeting, a productive though rather lengthy one, lasted some three and a half hours. Topics which were extensively discussed were the AFS referendum, Personnel Board hirings, honorariums and the new Movie Club.

The meeting started with the introduction and welcome of Anne MacEwen, the new Sophomore Class president, to her first Council meeting.

The first topic on the agenda was the A.F.S. (Atlantic Federation of Students) Referendum. Kevin Gauthier, president of the Union, made a motion that UPEI

Student Council approve a referendum to be held on October 11, 1978 in conjunction with the Student Union elections. President Gauthier

explained that A.F.S. was formed 3 - 4 years ago when students felt

there was a need to organize. He feels there is no need for Maritime students to organize.

UPEI students don't need to go through A.F.S. or the MPHEC. Instead, we can go directly to our

Provincial government since we are the only university in the province. He went on to

state that UPEI has had nothing but problems with A.F.S. New Brunswick

Coalition of Students are campaigning against A.F.S., as well as Memorial Newfoundland.

There is a lot of dissatisfaction in Newfoundland and the referendum will probably go against A.F.S.

President Gauthier went on to point out that if PEI, New Brunswick and Newfoundland are

dissatisfied with A.F.S. and are planning on getting out then how can it be called the ATLANTIC

Federation of Students if only Nova Scotia is a member.

Kevin also stated that P.E.I. has only one vote in the 15-member A.F.S. Nova Scotia dominates

the organization and why should a Nova Scotia group be setting policy for P.E.I. students?

Senator Emmanuel Amobi stated that some of Kevin's facts were wrong. There are two New Brunswick schools who are members of A.F.S., there is a need for a student organization because the issues and problems are still with us, and being members of A.F.S. does not stop us from dealing with the Provincial government since A.F.S. policy is not binding. A.F.S. is not the main student organization. Instead it is a complementary organization to all student councils and last of all, if we are not members of NUS (National Union of Students) then P.E.I. students will be isolated from the rest of Canada.

A good deal of discussion followed these arguments and it was finally decided that a referendum would be held on October 11th in the Robertson Library between 10:00 am and 4:00 pm.

Next on the agenda was: Personnel Board recommendations. The recommendations that were accepted by Council will appear elsewhere in this issue of the SUN.

One of the recommendations which was not accepted and was sent back to the Personnel Board for further consideration was Brian Walsh as Speaker of the Student Union. Although it was felt that Brian would be a good Speaker, there was the fact to consider that Alan Hilton was Speaker last year and has been acting as interim Speaker this semester.

Council also rejected the Personnel Board recommendations that Campus Police receive \$3.50 an hour for working "wet" events. Instead of sending this recommendation back to the Personnel Board, the Council discussed the matter and decided on a \$4.00 per hour wage.

Upstairs bartenders are to be paid \$2.75 an hour, Panther Lounge bartenders \$3.00 an hour and Campus Police at dry events, \$3.00 an hour.

Two UPEI students,

Chris Short and Tom Clarke, plan on starting a new Movie Club on campus. Shows are to be every Sunday evening at 7 and 9 P.M. starting on October 15th. A list of shows can be found elsewhere in this issue. The Student Union decided to support these students in their efforts to establish a movie club and financial arrangements will be made between the club and John Neville, Student Union treasurer.

The last topic on the agenda concerned Student Union honorariums. In years past the S.U. has given monetary honorariums at the end

of the year to people who have worked on various student union sub-committees. Kevin Gauthier stated that "the spirit of honorariums has been lost somewhere along the way". John Neville moved that the Student Union end monetary honorariums and have a banquet and party at the end of the year. "We should get more spirit into the thing instead of paying off in dollars and cents." Motion was passed.

Next Council meeting is to be in two weeks on October 15th at 6 PM in Kelley.
