COMMUNITY OF WEST ROYALTY/DR. PETER MEINCKE AWARD

This award of \$200 is available to a student graduating this year "who has excelled in the area of community services." Examples of this type of service might be: Big Brothers/Big Sisters, PEI Literacy Council, Minor Sports, 4-H, Church groups, Political parties. Application forms are available at the Registrar's Office and must be submitted no later than 4 p.m. on FRIDAY, 30 MARCH, 1990.

HENRY BIRKS & SONS GOLD MEDAL

This medal is awarded to a graduating student who has demonstrated to an outstanding degree qualities of scholarship and leadership within the University community. Recommendations for this award may be made by any member of the University community to the Awards Committee by 30 March. Winners of the Governor General's Medals will not be eligible for this award.

Recommendations and supporting material will be received in this office for onward transmission to the Awards Committee up to Friday, 30 March, 1990.

THE SCOTIABANK SCHOLARSHIPS - 1990/1991 VALUE

Two scholarships valued at \$12,500 each will be awarded for the 1990/91 academic year, to students entering the first year of the MBA program at Dalhousie University. The awards will be renewable, contingent upon the Scholars maintaining a high level of scholastic achievement in the first year of the award and continuing full time studies toward an MBA degree at Dalhousie. Scotiabank Scholars will have the option of a position of employment with the Bank for the months between the first and second years of the MBA program.

QUALIFICATION

Candidates must meet all the normal requirements for admission to the faculty of Graduate Studies and the MBA program at Dalhousie. Each Scotiabank Scholar will be a well-rounded in-

dividual who has demonstrated outstanding scholastic abilities in his or her undergraduate field of study. Only Canadian and Caribbean citizens and landed immigrants will be considered. Nominees will normally be below the age of 28 on September 1, 1990.

APPLICATION

Potential Scotiabank Scholars should write to Graduate Admissions, Dalhousie University, Hal-

ifax, Nova Scotia, B3H 4H6, requesting application materials for the Scotiabank Scholarship as well as the MBA program. The award application and supporting documentation must be returned to the University no later than April 15. Please note that the MBA program application must also be complete by that date in order to be considered for this award.

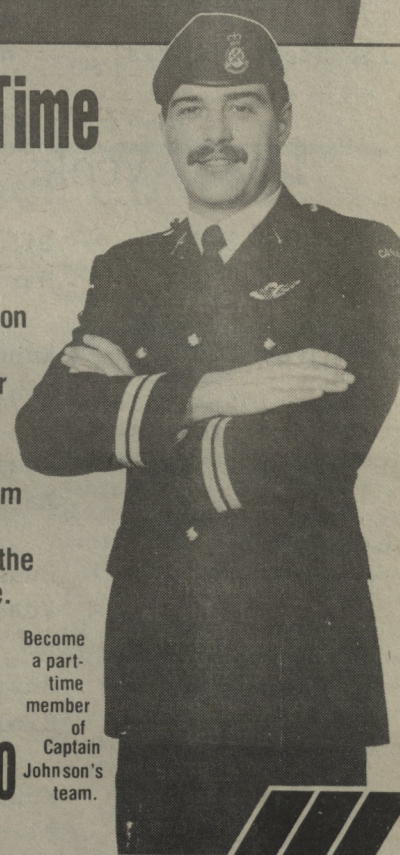

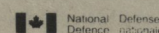
